Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

In SLA 00 \$250,000 (\$150,000 MHTAAR and \$100,000 AHFC Dividends) was appropriated for this program. In SLA 99 \$400,000 (\$\$150,000 GF/MH and \$250,000 AHFC Corporate Receipts) was appropriated for this program. Prior to that, a portion of the Special Needs Housing funds were used for this purpose. Funds allocated for this purpose were: FY97 – \$374,000; FY98 – \$250,000; and FY99 – \$500,000.

Project Description/Justification:

Project Description:

This project will increase the accessibility of current housing so Mental Health Trust beneficiaries and other special needs populations can move into or remain in their own homes. Home modifications are available to people wherever they reside, regardless whether they own or rent and with whom they live. Typical kinds of assistance provided are: accessibility modifications or additions (e.g., widen doorways, remodel bathrooms and/or kitchens, install entrance ramps, add bathrooms and/or bedrooms) and related equipment.

Grantees will coordinate their efforts with the AHFC Weatherization Program and similar tribal and municipal programs to supply essential repairs or upgrades to building structures (e.g., heating, plumbing, and/or electrical systems, roofs, water proofing, and energy efficiency improvements). Funds will not be available to duplicate down payment, mortgage buydown, or building repair and weatherization programs currently operated by AHFC.

Results: Appropriate housing is a key element of several sections of A Shared Vision II.

Indicators: Improved facility safety, functionality, and efficiency.

Performance Measures: Number of individuals achieving individual housing needs.
