Project Description/Justification:

AEA expects to receive approximately \$35 million in federal financial assistance awards from the Denali Commission and additional amounts from other federal agencies in FY 2004. The remaining unallocated federal receipt authority from FY2003 and this request will allow AEA to receive and expend these funds. AEA also expects to receive federal funds from the US Department of Energy and the US Department of Agriculture.

This request for federal receipt authority is necessary to continue with the bulk fuel upgrades, rural power system upgrades and the alternative energy programs.

The Denali Commission is the primary source of AEA's federal funds. The Denali Commission grants typically cover several AEA programs including bulk fuel upgrades, rural power system upgrades and alternative energy projects. The Denali Commission has also provided grant funding for an Energy Cost Reduction initiative. This initiative matches the Denali Commission Grant funds with the local communities' loan funds.
