#### **Component Mission**

The mission of the Public Safety Academy is to train law enforcement officers.

#### **Component Services Provided**

The Academy is primarily responsible for the basic police training of Alaska state troopers, Fish and Wildlife Protection troopers, state fire marshals, state park rangers, airport police, municipal police officers, and village public safety officers. The Academy teaches a variety of police-related courses under contract with University of Alaska Southeast (Sitka Campus), Alaska Police Standards Council and other agencies. The Academy also provides in-service training for state troopers and maintains Department of Public Safety personnel training records.

#### **Component Goals and Strategies**

Provide professional, basic Academy training for Alaska state troopers, Fish and Wildlife Protection troopers, airport police, state park rangers, municipal police officers and village public safety officers. The Academy will also provide inservice training to state troopers and maintain state trooper-training records.

#### **Key Component Issues for FY2003 – 2004**

Instate recruitment for troopers (and municipal police officers) becomes more difficult as the qualified applicant pool grows smaller. In-service training is essential to maintain proficiency of career officers and avoid state liability for problems traced to performance deficiencies. Maintaining the highest level of training to law enforcement professionals within the State of Alaska remains a challenge.

## **Major Component Accomplishments in 2002**

- 1. Provided basic police training (14 week session, twice per year) to:
  - 29 municipal police officers
  - 42 Alaska State Troopers and Fish and Wildlife Protection Troopers
  - 1 Alaska State Deputy Fire Marshals
  - 6 University of Alaska Southeast college students
- 2. Provided basic law enforcement training (8 week session, once per year) to:
  - 17 Village Public Safety Officers
- 3. Provided post-academy training (3 week session, twice per year) to:
  - 42 Alaska State Troopers and Fish and Wildlife Protection Troopers
- 4. Provided Alaska Police Standards Council mandated training (2 week session, once per year) for officers new to Alaska, but certified in other jurisdictions to:
  - 13 municipal police officers
- 5. Provided instructor support at Alaska State Trooper in-service (1 week session, three times per year) and at Fish and Wildlife Protection Trooper in-service (1 week session, once per year) to:
  - 141 Alaska State Troopers
  - 46 Fish and Wildlife Protection Troopers
- Provided Use of Force Instructor training to:
  - 6 Alaska State Troopers
  - 3 Fish and Wildlife Protection Troopers

- 7. Renovation of the existing building and construction of the new wing that includes an up-to-date fitness facility, multipurpose room, and new dorm rooms was completed.
- 8. Work was started on the Starrigavan River Shooting Range, which will provide a larger shooting facility in a less obtrusive location than the current range.
