Project Description/Justification:

Cover coat stockpiles are required to maintain or repair the sections that receive a high float surface treatment. These repairs are not possible without stockpiled materials. High mobilization costs including housing and support for contractors on small crushing jobs in remote areas can dramatically increase stockpile costs. Single small stockpiles (10,000 cubic yards) may average between \$18.00 and \$20.00 per yard on single site projects. Stockpiles purchased from on site contractors may average between \$10.00 and \$13.00 per yard. Therefore, purchasing from contractors in conjunction with existing projects is a very cost-effective approach to acquire these materials and allow maintenance efforts to be productive. Failure to acquire these stockpiles will severely hamper maintenances ability to address problematic areas and provide for timely repairs.

We intend to purchase about \$600,000 in stockpiled materials for remote areas on the Tok, Glenn, Richardson and Dalton Highways. Stockpile materials may be added to the following project contracts which will be underway during 2004:

Tok Cutoff: MP 30-38 Reconstruction

Richardson Highway: MP 350 Intersection Improvements

Glenn Highway: MP 92-97 Reconstruction Dalton Highway: MP 274-289 Reconstruction Dalton Highway: MP 362-414 Reconstruction
