Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

This project was partially funded in FY04 for \$8,100,000 with Receipt Authority. CH 82, SLA 2003

Project Description/Justification:

As anticipated, UAA is currently experiencing and projecting growth in student enrollment. The residence halls completed in 1998 are currently fully occupied with waiting lists generated for space each semester. The availability of on-campus housing is directly related to recruiting and retaining students for academic success. The housing and residence life programs have experienced growth with successful implementation of learning communities that are aligned with academic program initiatives. Student demand for on-campus living accommodations is very high. On average, campuses similar in size to UAA offer housing capacities equivalent to 35% of their student populations on average. With 950 total beds in inventory at UAA today, UA can only accommodate approximately 8% of its student population in on-campus housing.
