Contribution to Department's Mission

The College of Rural Alaska's mission is to make educational programs accessible to rural Alaskans and continue the traditions of the community college movement in focusing its instruction, research, and scholarship activities on the educational, cultural and developmental needs of the state and its peoples.

Core Services

The College of Rural Alaska (CRA) is organized into eleven interdependent units; six community campuses, the state's Cooperative Extension Services, the Center for Distance Education and Independent Learning, the Department of Alaska Native and Rural Development, CRA Health Programs and the Division of Rural Student Services. Through these units, CRA offers programs focused on academic transfer, vocational education and technical training, distance education courses, and research and information in agriculture; horticulture; natural resources; and community development.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2006

For FY06, no significant programmatic changes are anticipated. The goal will be to maintain educational excellence, to continue excellent programs and services to students and to maintain staff and facilities. The focus will be on efforts aimed at reallocating dollars internally to align academic and instructional programs with fiscal realities and institutional priorities.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2004

Reliable delivery of 120 independent learning courses.

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CRA/UAF cross collaboration award developed with CRA Executive Dean and UAF Provost.

Sue McHenry received the 2003-04 Associated Students of the University of Alaska, Fairbanks(ASUAF) Award for Outstanding UAF Staff at the annual UAF Awards for University Achievement.

Kay Thomas and Sue McHenry received 2003-04 awards from UAF student-athletes that "recognize a faculty or staff member who has in some way assisted in their progress toward a degree".

The Rural Alaska Honors Institute (RAHI) hired a new coordinator, Denise Wartes, who has served as RAHI administrative assistant for over 15 years.

RAHI 2004 graduated with 375 credits (an average of 8.52 credits). These students finished with an all time high average GPA of 2.94. On their Nelson Denny Reading tests, they tested out at a grade level of 13.7, reading an average of 1.5 grade levels above their chronological age.

RAHI 2004 served 44 students, with nine attending the university this fall, and the remaining 35 completing their senior year in high school. Presently, there are approximately 150 RAHI students attending UA.

CRA continues to build partnerships with health corporations, Native and regional nonprofit organizations, school districts, and businesses.
