Analysis of results and challenges: In FY2005, the ABC Board issued 20 Notices of Violation out of 396 compliance checks for the serving of alcohol to minors. This equaled a 95% compliance rate among the 1,398 beverage dispensary, restaurant, club, and package store licensees where this offense is most likely to occur. The number of these licensees varies by only 1-2% each year. The number of compliance checks did not meet our goal in FY2005 due to the loss of the Alaska State Trooper corporal to National Guard service and the subsequent difficulty of rehiring for the position. Funding for the compliance check program remains constant and reliable at present levels.

A1: Strategy - Have ABC Board investigators and law enforcement conduct compliance checks statewide.

Analysis of results and challenges: The number of compliance checks conducted was hampered due to the loss of the Alaska State Trooper corporal assigned this exclusive responsibility to National Guard service, and the difficulty in recruiting a replacement. Total compliance checks were conducted as follows: First Quarter-156, Second Quarter-217, Third Quarter-23, Fourth Quarter-0, for a total of 396 compliance checks. If the pace established in the second quarter were continued for the balance of the year, over 800 compliance checks would have been completed. Even with the loss of key personnel, targets were exceeded for the Fairbanks and Juneau area. In addition, when the compliance check program came to a close it had only 20 failures (instances where licensees sold to underage customers) out of 396 checks for a very respectable 95%

success rate.

It will be a continuing challenge to meet the targets for Anchorage and rural Alaska.

Key Component Challenges

Investigator staffing remains at levels below that which existed prior to the construction of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline. Inadequate staffing prevents proactive enforcement and increases the danger to the public attributable to underage drinking and alcohol-related accidents and deaths.

The board plans to continue the collection and processing of fingerprint cards on all liquor license holders. This process began in FY2006 and this year's effort completes the collection process for persons holding a biennial liquor license. When completed, this will allow the ABC Board to be notified of instances when liquor licensees have a substantive contact with the criminal justice system and ensure that only people who are fully qualified hold liquor licenses.

The ABC Board will now license "Outdoor Recreation Lodges" as required by legislation enacted in 2005. This could include issuing as many as 400 new licenses for businesses located in remote parts of the state.

The ABC Board needs to maintain its system of receiving, tracking, and reconciling the revenue it collects for licenses, permits, penalties, and fines. This can only fully be addressed, given present staffing limitations, with a well maintained and fully integrated licensing data base.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2007

The ABC Board will finish the process it started in FY2006 of completing criminal background checks of its liquor licensees. Processing fingerprint cards for the second half of licensees in the biennial license cycle will improve public safety by providing more complete knowledge of its licensees.

The ABC Board, with installation of a new licensing data base in FY2006, will be able to do a better job of keeping track of liquor licensee activity, changes in ownership and location of licenses, tracking receipt of money and reconciling funds received, and providing useful information regarding liquor licenses.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2005

- Resolved 100 percent of civil accusations by imposing ABC Board sanctions.
- Conducted inspections in remote area of Alaska and conducted 583 premise inspections with limited travel and personnel resources.
- Successfully administered Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws Program grant.
- For one full year beginning July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005, the ABC Board issued 35 Notices of Violation, which produced the following compliance rates for beverage dispensary, restaurant, club, and package store licensees (total of 1,398 licenses of these types) of the following types of violations:

Lack of server training
