#1	Districtwide Fuel Tank Disposal and Soil Remediation	This project would provide for the removal of all obsolete fuel tanks and remediation of contaminated soil from seven of the district's school sites, including Allakaket, Huslia, Manley, Minto, Hughes, Nulato and Ruby.	\$2,796,252
#2	Kaltag K-12 School Heating System Replacement	The Kaltag School heating system is unreliable and prone to failure. This project would replace the antiquated forced air system with a hydronic heating system.	\$1,073,724

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<p>9. Detailed project description and justification</p>	<p>The Kaltag School heating system consists of a series of Singer forced air furnaces and draft inducer units. The Singer brand heating units have reached their life expectancy. The system is now obsolete, and because the company sold its heating division years ago parts are difficult to acquire.</p> <p>The school also relied upon the village’s recovered heat from the power plant that was located next to the school. A new power plant was constructed in 2005 further away from the school; an attempt was made to utilize waste heat from the new power plant, but because of the distance, heat recovery was minimal. This caused a greater demand on the school’s forced air heating units.</p> <p>The school’s remote location, coupled with Kaltag’s harsh winters underscore the need for a dependable heating system; reliability remains a concern. During the fall of 2006, the heating system failed, forcing the school to close for several days.</p> <p>The requested funding will allow for replacement of the antiquated forced air system with a hydronic heating system, and the construction of a building behind the school to house the boilers and controls.</p> <p>No part of this project can be defined as a maintenance or custodial issue. This request for funding is a one time, non-recurring request.</p>
