This amendment reduces the FY2009 Governor's Budget by \$2,175,000 Federal Receipts and \$1,325,000 International Airport Revenue Funds for a new FY2009 total of \$18,000,000. ## Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

FY2008 - \$4,100,000; FY2004 - \$14,217,000.

## **Project Description/Justification:**

Improvements include items such as: high speed taxiways, new taxiways to new development and associated tug/service roads, and other taxiway and runway incursion improvements. This funding request will complete a portion of taxiway and runway improvements on a priority basis.

The project includes two components: an Environmental Impact Study (EIS) for a planned new North-South runway and the construction of improvements and repairs to Taxiways E and G in the vicinity of Taxiway K. The need for a new runway was identified in the 2002 airport master plan. It is expected that the current work on the master plan update will also identify the runway need and the need to perform an EIS. The EIS will complete all of the environmental documentation required by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) prior to proceeding with the new runway design and FAA funding. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by planning for increased airport capacity to meet expected demand, thereby improving the transportation of people and goods.

The improvements and repairs to Taxiways E and G are required to upgrade them to aircraft Design Group VI standards, to improve airfield safety, and to reduce congestion around the South Terminal.
