Project Description/Justification:

The regions would like to expand their use of anti-icing chemicals. A project was funded in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program to purchase storage tanks and spreading equipment but was disapproved by the Federal Highway Administration. They believe that anti-icing is a maintenance item and is therefore not eligible for federal reimbursement. This funding would be used in all regions to purchase storage tanks and associated piping/hosing and applicators for applying the chemicals.
