## **Project Description/Justification:**

As we have constructed and improved highways and airports, we have increased the number of lane miles we maintain and operate. We have been able to absorb these responsibilities by keeping old equipment. We currently have 324 maintenance vehicles, including pickup trucks, plow trucks, graders, sanders, etc. that cost \$2.3 million annually to maintain. They need to be replaced with new units with operating and replacement rates that are built into the annual budget. Total replacement cost for all units is \$31 million.

Funding is also need to purchase attenuator and warning devices to be used by roving maintenance and operations crews. These attachments are placed on dump trucks and serve to protect our crews working alongside and on the roadways. Over the last few months our crews have been hit by errant drivers resulting in severe injuries for Department of Transportation and Public Facilities' staff and the death of one driver. These attenuator and flashing message/arrow boards will provide a significant barrier to protect the crews.

The Highway Equipment Working Capital Fund does not have the resources to purchase the additional units needed to properly maintain our assets. Additional funds are needed to replace units before they become a severe drain on the regions limited budgets.
