Project Description/Justification:

The Lake Louise Airport is currently closed due to poor (unusable) runway conditions, including dips, ponds, bumps, swales, and no surfacing. The only access into the area is by road from the Glenn Highway. There is no school in Lake Louise and the residents attend schools in Glennallen. Currently residents and recreationists use the Lake Louise Road as a runway or access the area via float plane. The area is a popular recreational cabin area with a swelling seasonal population. It is a natural location for an airport. Improvements to the Lake Louise airport are recommended in the Copper Basin and Upper Tanana Regional Airport Plan (2003).

Operating and maintenance costs will be approximately \$10,000 per year beginning in 2010.
