Department of Transportation/Public Facilities Fairbanks Airport Safety Component Budget Summary

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Component: Fairbanks Airport Safety

Contribution to Department's Mission

Perform Airport Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF), law enforcement, emergency medical technician and other safetyrelated services necessary to meet Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) airport certification and Transportation Security Administration (TSA) security requirements.

Core Services

Airport Police and Fire (AP&F), which is funded by the Safety component, provides the following services on a 24-hour/365 day per year basis:

- ARFF: Plan, staff, train for, and respond to real and simulated aircraft and bomb threat incidents, accidents, and natural disasters.
- Law Enforcement: Meet part 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) and state law enforcement statutory and regulatory requirements.
- Manage mandated airport security processes: Airport Security Plan, background checks, badge processes, and airport access control.
- Manage airport permits for General Aviation tie down and float pond parking, taxi cabs, airport shuttle vehicle, and ramp vehicle access security.

Key Component Challenges

- Staffing Officer recruitment and retention to maintain FAA and TSA federally mandated ARFF, law enforcement
 and security standards. At the beginning of FY07 over half of AP&F's officer positions were vacant despite
 continuous recruiting efforts through Workplace Alaska. This put the Fairbanks International Airport (FAI) at risk of
 not meeting service objectives and federally mandated safety and security requirements. FAI is using vast amounts
 of overtime and double overtime, as well as temporary reassignment of Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport
 officers to FAI to maintain required shift minimums. Positions have been filled, but training takes a minimum of
 sixteen months after recruitment which affects FY08 and FY09. Position vacancies create ripple effects in all
 services and accomplishments the department is able to provide. Failure to consistently meet shift minimums and
 response times every day can adversely affect the Airport's operating certificate.
- Future Alaska-wide development initiatives such as a gas pipeline, additional oil and mineral development, tourism and military growth will place more pressure on strained resources, as do continuing efforts to prevent alcohol from entering dry bush communities through the airport.
- Additional pressures will be placed on this section when transitioning to the new terminal which will require a new security plan, badging and access control all in compliance with TSA and FAA regulations.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2009

FAI may be unable to meet federal mandates and service requirements for ARFF and Police if the current downward trend in recruitment and retention is not reversed and improved.

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Major Component Accomplishments in 2007

- Recruited and hired 12 new Airport Police and Fire Officers who are now in training.
- Relocated administrative position from the Leasing Office to AP&F to support permit and security process and allow existing officers to direct energies to federal required staffing minimums.
- Executed a new Letter of Agreement with PSEA and made the transition from three 8-hour shifts to four 12-hour shifts to use limited work force more effectively.
- Obtained new federal grants \$620,000 for closed circuit TVs as part of the Terminal Development Project, and \$2.4 million from the TSA for a five-year program of enhanced law enforcement support.
- Developed K-9 and interdiction programs for the Airport.
