Key Component Challenges

Implementation of the Offender Programs Task Force plan.

Conduct centralized General Education Diploma (GED) testing for institutions in the south central region. Lead Education Coordinators in implementing and using standardized parenting program. Direct the focus of Education Coordinators in four areas of education: Adult Basic Education (ABE), GED, vocational education, and apprenticeships.

Meet the increased demand for: training and oversight of volunteer clergy and lay religious volunteers, prisoner requests for spiritual counseling from chaplains and for increased religious services, religious diversity requests from the prisoner population, and death notifications.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

The Substance Abuse Treatment program and Sex Offender Management program are being transferred out of Offender Habilitation Programs component into the Inmate Health Care component in FY2010.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

During the last year 182 offenders received their General Education Development (GED) diploma while incarcerated in FY2008. Eleven youth offenders received their High School diplomas at Spring Creek Correctional Center. During FY2008, the Department of Corrections began the process of partnering with Department of Labor and Workforce Development to encourage apprenticeship programs at Palmer Correctional Center and Point MacKenzie Correctional Farm.

The Faith-based Residential program, Transformational Living Community (TLC) at Palmer Correctional Center opened February 2004, is now in its fifth year of operation. A maximum of 37 residents occupy one complete housing unit in this intensive 12-18 month therapeutic program. All program costs, including staffing, are funded by private sector donations through Alaska Correctional Ministries. Since its inception there have been a total of 51

graduates.

The Transformational Living Community at the Red Rock facility is in its seventh year of operation. There are now two complete housing units with a maximum capacity of 60 residents each. Since the inception of this program, there have been 89 graduates.
