#### Key Component Challenges

Recruit, hire and retain a workforce of well-trained officers to meet the challenge of public protection.

Reduce the ongoing deterioration of the facility and backlog of deferred maintenance that continues to negatively impact daily operations.

Provide safety, security, and consistency in daily operations with inmate counts routinely higher than facility capacity.

Inmate population continues to drive exceptional transportation and medical costs in an attempt to assure appropriate prisoner care and institutional safety. The inmate population continues to create numerous logistical and financial challenges.

Anvil Mountain Correctional Center (AMCC) faces similar challenges as all other state correctional facilities: it must meet operational expectations while striving to remain within fiscal parameters. AMCC is developing innovative ways to reduce utility costs. Steadily rising fuel costs in rural areas such as Nome have equated to significant increases in utility costs and freight charges.

Participate in review, design, planning and coordination of facility expansion project with Department management.

Maintain a comprehensive preventative maintenance program with 22+ year old mechanical and security systems to reduce the ongoing deterioration of the facility and backlog of deferred maintenance that continues to negatively impact daily operations.

## Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

#### Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

staff to continue to maintain an efficient security operation.

Completed the upgrade of the Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) surveillance security system adding additional cameras and increased recording capability improving security and facilitating prisoner management.

Achieve training goals of providing prisoner time accounting certification to shift officers, acquiring a facility-assigned Firearms Instructor, and adding two Prisoner Transport Officer's (PTO) to the Correctional Officer contingent. This allowed one PTO assigned per shift team and maintaining current PTO qualifications helping the facility exponentially with prisoner transport needs.

Achieve full compliance with worksite OSHA requirements in consult with Alaska Division of Occupational Health and through development of a complete facility Safety and Health Program manual.

A continuing concerted effort has been made to promote regional hires. As a result several recent Correctional Officers and support staff positions, 90% or better, were filled with applicants from the Bering Straits region.

Completed 47% of the planned retrofit of identified electrical and plumbing fixtures through out the facility. This was in connection with Alaska Department of Transportation, for the Energy Conservation Project to reduce usage of electrical power and water usage within the facility.
