Component: Senior Benefits Payment Program

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Senior Benefits program helps low-income seniors who are at least 65 years of age remain independent in the community by providing a cash benefit.

Core Services

 The Senior Benefits program provides monthly cash assistance to needy seniors. Payments are \$125.00, \$175.00, or \$250.00 per month depending on the senior's gross annual income. Income limits are tied to Alaska's Federal Poverty Level Guidelines, which are adjusted every year.

Key Component Challenges

• Continued growth in the Senior Benefit caseload is expected. Initial estimates were that 10,700 seniors would qualify for assistance under this new program by FY09. The caseload reached almost 9,000 by July 2008. It is expected that potentially eligible seniors will continue to apply for benefits as they become aware of the program through further outreach efforts.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

The division estimates program enrollment will reach 10,221 in FY10 as more seniors learn about the program and apply, and that the caseload will grow at a slower rate in future years in accordance with population demographics.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

- Implemented the new Senior Benefits Program in August 2007.
- Successfully reenrolled 7,000 SeniorCare recipients to the new program with no interruption in assistance, and found an additional 2,000 senior applicants eligible for assistance.
- About 5,100 seniors are receiving their benefits via direct deposit.
