Component: Infant Learning Program Grants

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Infant Learning Program is committed to promoting access to a flexible array of quality services to every Alaskan infant and toddler with special developmental needs and to their families. The Alaska Early Intervention/Infant Learning Program (EI/ILP) provides early intervention services and supports to families of children age birth to three years who have or are at risk for developmental delays. Services are provided in a manner that respects families, communities and cultural differences and promotes genuine partnerships in all aspects of service design and delivery.

Core Services

- Provide comprehensive, coordinated, home-based early intervention services to families through a system of grantees across Alaska.
- Ensure young children who may have disabilities or developmental delays receive an evaluation to identify the potential need for early intervention/infant learning services.
- Promote positive development and improved health outcomes for Alaska's children prenatal to 8 years through the Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems Project.
- Strengthen families through Early Care and Education as a child abuse prevention approach that focuses on building protective factors in families with young children.

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Key Component Challenges

The Early Intervention and Infant Learning Program (EI/ILP) need for services has increased significantly and the quantity of services being delivered has declined under budgetary constraints. Program grantees report the estimated need for 20 positions to fill the gap between services being provided and the need for services. From 2005 through 2008, 134 more children were enrolled in infant learning programs while services directly provided to clients declined from 2,102 client home visits in 2003 to 1,732 in 2007. Speech contacts have decreased from 4,600 in 2005 to 3,600 in 2008. EI/ILP grantees are struggling to provide adequate services.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

If resources allow, EI/ILP will restore service levels for children, and train professionals to meet qualifications as defined by the federal government. Those with bachelor's degrees outside of the early childhood special education area who are working as primary special education teachers for young children do not meet the federal No Child Left Behind standard of "highly qualified."

The work being done by EI/IL programs feeds into the mission of the department at the front end where the desired outcome to prevent child abuse and neglect can best be addressed. If funding is appropriated to the level where children waiting for services can be provided, the EI/IL program will realize increased prevention outcomes in FY2010.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

In FY2008, the Infant Learning Program Family Outcomes Survey results for state infant and toddler programs asked for family experiences based on the following family outcome areas:

- 1. Families understand their child's strengths, abilities, and special needs.
- 2. Families know their rights and advocate effectively for their children.
- 3. Families help their child develop and learn.
- 4. Families have support systems.
- 5. Families access desired services, programs and activities in their community.
- 6. Families are satisfied with services they received.
