## **Component: Delta Career Advancement Center**

#### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The Partners for Progress in Delta Inc. operate the Delta Career Advancement Center in Delta Junction. The operation contributes to the mission of the department by providing market-driven vocational and technical training and education in the region and by creating an environment that promotes commitment to education and career advancement.

The department has no authority over the management of the program.

#### **Core Services**

- Partners for Progress is an educational consortium created to deliver education and job training for skilled workforce development and career advancement. The partners are Tanana Valley Campus (TVC) of the University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF), Delta Mine Training Center (DMTC), Alaska Works Partnership (AWP), UAF Cooperative Extension Service (CES) and the Delta/Greely School District (DGSD).
- The Delta Career Advancement Center brings a range of resources to deliver creative, custom, community and regionally driven programs.
- The Delta Career Advancement Center provides Alaskans with one of the best facilities for construction trades training and education in the region.
- Delta currently has the most substantial mine training facility in the state.

## **Key Component Challenges**

Ensuring a consistent level of funding is critical to maintain the integrity of the existing programs while continuing to improve the quality of training and job placement rates. Having necessary resources to adapt training courses to meet industry needs is essential to providing job opportunities for students.

The high cost of energy to operate existing facilities will have a negative impact on the resources available for direct instructional services. The lack of housing associated with the Delta facility limits their ability to attract large numbers of residents living outside the immediate Delta Junction area for lengthy programs. It has resulted in the development of intensive academies and course schedules that aim to get participants in and out and credentialed as appropriate. The board of directors is updating its three-year strategic plan to take a serious look at capital needs to meet anticipated increase in demand for classes and training academies.

## Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

They expect to continue their success in direct placements into apprenticeships and will work with area developers to provide entry level field helpers for the 2009 and 2010 field seasons.

# Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

welding academy, establishing a viable adult program. They planned the 2008 summer academy as an intensive introduction to welding for 10 participants ages 17-to-24.

Welding booths funded through a Rasmuson Foundation grant were up and running by spring 2008 so they could deliver the first welding class through UAF Tanana Valley Campus—a three-credit university class. Employees of Bechtel and Boeing were in the first class, and Bechtel supported the program through the purchase of a Fisher Engineering Roller Guided Bend Tester weld-testing machine. Welding I and Welding II are offered this fall.

As of November 2008, 13 academy program participants received direct placements into apprenticeships with the trades.
