Department of Labor and Workforce Development Workers' Compensation Component Budget Summary

Component: Workers' Compensation

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Workers' Compensation component contributes to the department's mission by advancing injured workers' employment opportunities. It does so by ensuring the quick, efficient, fair, and predictable delivery of indemnity, medical, and vocational rehabilitation benefits intended to enable workers to return to work at a reasonable cost to employers.

Core Services

- Provide support to insurers, claims administrators, employers, health providers, and injured workers by administering files, collecting data, maintaining case files, and reproducing information.
- Facilitate the adjudication of disputes between parties through administration of Alaska Workers' Compensation Board hearings.
- Assist injured workers return to work through administration of vocational rehabilitation benefits and training.
- Assist employers with alternative to voluntary insurance market by administering executive officer waiver and workers' compensation self insurance programs.
- Monitor employer compliance with insurance requirements of the Workers' Compensation Act through administration of proof-of-insurance program.
- Investigate uninsured employers and workers' compensation claim fraud.

Key Component Challenges

The current Workers' Compensation data processing system is outdated and reaching the end of its lifecycle and maintenance support from Microsoft. A complete rewrite and upgrade of the system is needed to ensure data integrity is maintained. The Division has requested a Capital Project of \$3,092.2 funded from the Workers Safety Account to cover the costs of the system upgrade and to provide funding for Phase III of the Insurance Claims Expense Reporting System (ICERS) project.

Updating of the Reemployment Benefits Evaluation Guide is underway. Procedures in the reemployment benefits program to monitor injured workers participating in reemployment training plans are being updated to reflect statutory changes. Staffing turnover including the Reemployment Benefits Administrator has slowed the process of implementing the desired changes.

In FY08 the Fraud Investigation Section began submitting Stipulations of Undisputed Facts and Proposed Resolution to ease the increased workload placed on the adjudication section in the prior year. As this is a new procedure there is an ongoing challenge to find appropriate penalties agreeable to both employers and the Workers' Compensation Board.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

No changes in results are anticipated.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

In FY 08, the Fraud Investigations section opened 398 cases. The cases represented a total of 79,611 uninsured employee days. 124 of those cases were brought before the Workers' Compensation Board for assessment of penalties.

In FY 08, the Fraud Investigations section began submitting Stipulations of Undisputed Facts and Proposed Resolution to ease the increased workload placed on the adjudication section in the prior year. Through the stipulation process, the Fraud Investigations section was able to close an additional 62 cases. This procedure has decreased the overall workload for the adjudications section.

The second phase of our Electronic Data Interface (EDI) project was completed. We are ready to begin testing the online submission of Injury and Illness Reports.
