Department of Labor and Workforce Development Mechanical Inspection Component Budget Summary

Component: Mechanical Inspection

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Mechanical Inspection component contributes to the department's mission by reducing hazards to life and property posed by unsafe boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, escalators, trams, lifts, and electrical and plumbing work.

Core Services

- Ensure boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, escalators, lifts, and electrical and plumbing work complies with the code.
- Ensure individuals engaged in electrical, plumbing, power line, boiler, asbestos, hazardous paint and explosive work have an appropriate certificate of fitness.
- Provide assistance to the Department of Revenue, Child Support Enforcement Division, by identifying certificate of fitness applicants who are in arrears on child support payments.
- Provide enforcement assistance to the Department of Community and Economic Development to ensure that electricians, plumbers, construction contractors and electrical/mechanical administrators have proper certificates and licenses.
- Enforce Alaska vehicle registration requirements under AS 28.10.121 on construction projects to focus attention on and improve Alaska resident hire.

Major Activities to Advance Strategies

- Test applicants and issue certificates to qualified plumbers, electricians, power line workers and boiler operators.
- Perform on-site inspections of boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, and electrical and plumbing work for code compliance.
- Issue certificates of fitness for asbestos workers, hazardous painters and explosives handlers.

Key Component Challenges

Mechanical Inspection's funding for elevator, boiler/pressure vessel, electrical and plumbing inspections are currently 100 percent fee supported. Current fees are not sufficient to cover program costs, but fee increases may not be appropriate from an equity perspective given associated workplace safety benefits produced by inspections. It is estimated that 20 percent of an inspection is associated with worker safety with the remainder split between public safety and building integrity. Consequently, we request the funding source for the inspections be split with Worker Safety Account revenue providing 20 percent (\$294.5) of the funding. The increase would be offset by a matching reduction to Building Safety Account funding.

Mechanical Inspection requests \$15.0 in Interagency Receipt Authorization to align with receipts from the Department of Commerce for License Enforcement and from the Department of Revenue for Child Support Enforcement.

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Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

Mechanical Inspection reclassified an administrative position to a Boiler Inspector at the end of FY08. This position has been filled, however this has created a vacancy in the Northern Region. Our efforts to fill all Boiler Inspector positions will continue in FY10 with an aim to decrease the boiler inspection backlog and increase the percentage of boiler and pressure vessel violations corrected.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

Even with continued vacancies, Mechanical Inspection experienced a 14% reduction in the boiler inspection backlog from FY07 to FY08.
