### **Additional Information / Prior Funding History:**

FY2009 - \$1,600,000; FY2007 - \$1,700,000.

#### **Project Description/Justification:**

Safe Routes to Schools coordination for Alaska per SAFETEA-LU, Section 1404, and implement the educational and outreach portion of the Safe Routes to Schools Program.

Step 1 to prepare a plan is complete.

Step 2 will be plan implementation:

Construction projects eligible under this program are: sidewalk improvements, traffic calming
and speed reduction improvements, pedestrian and bicycle crossing improvements, on-street
bicycle facilities, off-street bicycle and pedestrian facilities, secure bike parking, and traffic
diversion improvements in the vicinity of schools (within approximately two miles). Such projects
may be carried out on any public road or any public bicycle or pedestrian pathway or trail in the
vicinity of schools.

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Each State must use a portion of the funds for non-infrastructure-related activities to encourage
walking and bicycling to school. These include public awareness campaigns and outreach to
press and community leaders; traffic education and enforcement in the vicinity of schools,
student sessions on bicycling and pedestrian safety, health, and environment, and training
volunteers and managers of safe routes to school programs.
