Project Description/Justification:

On September 29, 2008, the Environmental Protection Agency released a new multi-sector general permit (MSGP) regulating the discharge of stormwater from industrial facilities in 29 different industrial sectors. The MSGP 2008 replaces the MSGP 2000 that expired on October 20, 2005. The MSGP 2008 requires industrial facilities to implement and maintain site-specific stormwater control measures and to develop stormwater pollution prevention plans (SWPPPs). For the department, the applicable sectors include: airports, harbors, ferry terminals and select material sites. Failure to comply with the new regulations will mean that the department will be in regulatory violation and subject to enforcement actions and regulatory fines.
