Brief Summary and Statement of Need:
 Update the Airport's F.A.R. Part 150 Noise Program, including review and revision of the Airport's Noise Exposure Map and Noise Compatibility Program. Federal Aviation Administration AC 150/5020-1, Chapter 1, Section 3.36(b) recommends periodic reviews of the Airport's Noise Compatibility Program every three to five years. The last noise study was approved by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in January of 2000. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.
