Project Description/Justification:

This authority enables the Alaska International Airport System (AIAS) to accept capital contributions and receive reimbursement for work requested by airport tenants, private citizens, or other agencies on capital construction projects. The net result is a substantial savings to the airport system and the airlines. This project does not affect the airlines rates and fees.

An example of a project that utilized this authority is the Taxiway T project. The primary tenant, Federal Express (Fed Ex) requested project changes prior to paving. Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport (ANC) incorporated the requested changes into the project and Fed Ex then reimbursed ANC for the costs of their requested changes.

This legislative authority will greatly simplify the ability to be reimbursed and accurately track project expenditures.
