**Project Description/Justification:**

The community of Newtok is subject to catastrophic flooding that could leave the approximately 350 residents without shelter, food, water, sanitation, and a safe place to gather during emergencies. Higher ground in Newtok is limited to the existing airport runway and a few small areas unsuitable for sheltering people displaced by flood waters. The people of Newtok need an emergency center they can reach and safely occupy for a limited time.
