- Contracts Branch: Reviews construction documents, provides bid packages, advertises and awards contracts, prepares certified bid tabulations, and helps resolve bidding disputes. Coordinates, solicits, selects, prepares and administers professional services agreements.

Key Component Challenges

The SAFETEA-LU (Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users) Transportation Act has increased the level of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funds nationwide, creating competition across the country for trained and experienced construction engineering personnel. The State's engineers salary level has made it difficult to hire and retain experienced personnel. Although modest wage increases in recent years have helped, we are still having difficulties recruiting and retaining engineers, which is the reason for our unusually high vacancy rate.

Environmental issues continue to be a challenge. Environmental constraints in our coastal rain forest environment require extreme diligence on the part of our field staff and complicate nearly every contract modification being contemplated. This results in increased costs and additional time needed to develop and construct transportation projects.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2010

No significant changes are anticipated in FY2010.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2008

Received over \$67 million in federal highway, federal aviation, general fund, and reimbursable construction authorization in FFY08.

Processed approximately \$96 million in contractor payments in FFY08.

Completed major road reconstructions in Ketchikan (1.7 miles), Petersburg (7.5 miles), and Sitka (0.5 miles).

Completed pavement rehabilitation projects in Ketchikan (1.2 miles), Juneau (0.8 miles), and Haines (0.8 miles).

Opened Juneau's first grade-separated interchange to traffic (Egan Drive at Sunny Point).

Completed the replacement of the bridge bearings under Sitka's O'Connell Bridge.

Constructed improvements to the ferry terminal at Sitka, Pelican, and Haines.

Completed major expansions of the Runway Safety Areas at the Wrangell and Ketchikan airports.

Completed asphalt pavement overlays of the runways at Ketchikan Airport and Klawock Airport.

Completed the \$25.7 million design-build contract for the first stage of the Gravina Island Highway, which is the road component of the Gravina Island Access project. This project included 3.2 miles of new gravel road, 1.2 miles of widening of existing gravel road, and two minor concrete girder bridges.

Completed the first phase of the reconstruction of the boardwalk system in Pelican.

Completed the second berth Relieving Slab at the Ketchikan Shipyard.

Closed out 20 completed construction contracts totaling \$30.2 million in FFY08.

Obtained materials testing qualifications for 11 new technicians and engineers, and re-qualified 12 technicians and engineers under the Western Alliance for Quality in Transportation Construction program.
