Project Description/Justification:

This funding will be used to operate, maintain, upgrade, and expand the Alaska maritime vessel tracking network. The tracking network aids in the safe, secure, efficient and environmentally sound maritime operations.

With past support the Marine Exchange of Alaska has been able to develop the vessel tracking system used by several state agencies (the Departments of Transportation and Public Facilities, Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Fish and Game, Public Safety and Environmental Conservation), the U.S. Coast Guard and the maritime community. This past year, the system's automated tracking of cruise ships reduced the cost incurred by the cruise industry to help meet the environmental monitoring requirement as well as provided a safety net. Additionally, all state ferries are tracked by the system and the Department of Environmental Conservation uses the system to monitor vessels conducting paralytic shellfish poison (PSP) testing of oyster farms and to monitor vessel compliance with environmental regulations throughout Alaska.

The Coast Guard recently entered into a five year contract with the Marine Exchange to help fund the operations of the system. Alaska now has the maritime industry, the State of Alaska and the Coast Guard all contributing to the build out and operation of the system.
