END RESULT A: Local governments provide essential services and operate in a sustainable manner.

- In FY10, 96% of municipal governments were estimated to have provided essential public services, an increase of 5% over the prior year.
- Between FY09 and FY10, there was a 2.67% increase in the number of rural utilities which met all essential management indicators. Although there was an increase, it falls short of the target of 5%.
- In FY10, 12% of taxing municipalities were audited. A goal of 20% is still set.
- 25% reduction in the number of communities that are not compliant with management sustainability indicators, significantly surpassing the 5% reduction goal for FY10.

Status of Strategies to Achieve End Result

- 98.7% of municipalities submitted statutorily required budgets and audits/certified financial statements on time in FY10, an increase of 1.9% from FY09.
- 38.46% increase in the number of successful interventions in communities due to monitoring of key indicators from FY09, significantly exceeding the target of 5%.
- 5.03% increase in the number of communities regularly monitored by division staff from FY09 to FY10, meeting the target of 5%.
- 98.99% of communities qualified for financial resource programs in FY10; an increase of 6.97% from FY09.
- A 29.2% increase in grants per administrator occurred in FY10 due to the 207.44% increase in new grants, curtailing the ability to meet the target.
- In FY10, the target of equalizing total value of assessable property in 100% of municipalities that levied property taxes was met.
- 94% achieved on full value determinations and 88% on on-site inspections of non-taxing municipalities required by statute in the FY07 to FY10 reporting period but not meeting the target of 100%.
- Completed recalibration of five of six categories in the value model in FY10.

Major Activities to Advance Strategies

- Technical assistance and bulk fuel loans to communities ineligible under other fuel loan programs
- On-site assistance to grantees on grant management, and administer the increasing number of grants awarded to communities
- Train community officials to build capacity to operate Complete new full value determinations on all non-

Major Activities to Advance Strategies

- local governments and utility facilities through on-site assistance and regional training
- Assist communities in resolving payroll tax issues prior to IRS or Department of Labor liens and levies being filed
- Negotiate and finalize ANCSA 14(c)(3) settlements to provide lands for public development as well as private economic development
- Coordinate federal, state and local resources to provide for digital community mapping for use in community planning and infrastructure development
- taxing municipalities every two years and on-site inspections every four years
- Collect information on rural communities to provide a basis for emerging policy decisions
- Provide on-site and regional training to municipal staff regarding tax assessment, valuation, and collection issues
- Administer the Alaska Coastal Management, National Flood Insurance, and Map Modification programs to provide planning resources to communities

Key Component Challenges

Sustainability of communities is a major issue due to: 1) increasing operating costs for major budget items such as transportation and insurance, 2) staff turnover as residents migrate to seek higher paying jobs, and 3) the potential for reduction in federal funding to communities. The division expects increases in technical assistance and financial intervention requests to continue as communities seek to address these issues. Funding available to local governments, from either locally generated sources, state and federal shared revenue or grants, needs to maximize efficiencies and provide services to residents.

Sustainability indicators are not being met in 30% or 113 of the 386 communities with populations between 25 and 2,500. Not only is state and federal infrastructure and investment at risk in these communities, but the communities are not eligible for financial assistance if they are not meeting basic sustainability requirements.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2012

No significant changes to component. DCRA requests continued funding for FY12 will be used to reduce the backlog of community assistance requests regarding negotiation and finalization of ANCSA 14(c) conveyances. In 1971 when ANCSA was passed, there were 95 unincorporated ANCSA communities that had a land conveyance obligation to the state in trust under section 14(c) (3). Currently there are still over 50 communities that have not completed the conveyance and the obligation still exists. Currently the Municipal Lands Trustee program holds title to over 13,500 acres in 48 different communities. As communities develop and need to make use of land, the program must negotiate appropriate conveyances for land. Frequently these conveyances are required as part of a capital construction project. In the FY11 budget a new position was requested and received to assist in this effort, continuation of this position will continue improved services.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2010

Local Government Assistance

- DCRA increased the number of interventions with at risk communities by 72%.
- The Bulk Fuel Bridge Loan program provided funding to 21 different communities during 2010. The fall
 ordering period showed a reduction in the number of loans, as seven communities that were previously
 rejected by the Bulk Fuel Revolving Loan fund as not credit worthy were approved for their new loans.
- Continuation of the *Fuel Watch* initiative, that started in 2009, made over 850 calls to 341 different community entities in an effort to verify that there were adequate fuel supplies, or fuel supply systems in place
- Increased local government assistance in Kotzebue, Nome, and Juneau.

Impacts of Climate Change

- Administered four grants appropriated to Kivalina, Shishmaref, Newtok, and Unalakleet as part of the recommendations of the Immediate Action Work Group of the Governor's Climate Change Sub-Cabinet Provided technical assistance to the communities of Atmautluak, Kipnuk, Elim, Nelson Lagoon, Nightmute, and Quinhagak in the administration of their Designated Legislative Grants to plan for mitigating impacts of climate change.
- Continued coordination of a state and federal interagency group to provide assistance to the community of

Newtok in its relocation effort. Received funding approval from the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation and Enforcement in the amount of \$100,000 to provide for a Newtok Environmental Site Inventory and Assessment.

Rural Utility Business Advisor (RUBA) Program

- RUBA staff assisted 167 communities, including 123 on-site trips to communities.
- The number of communities that met the essential indicators of the RUBA management assessment was 77, which is an increase over the previous year by two. Meeting these indicators is a grant condition for a community's sanitation facility grant eligibility. The indicators must be met before the construction phase of the grant can begin.
- The number of communities that met both the essential and sustainable indicators in the RUBA management assessment increased by 24 in 2010.
- RUBA staff presented eleven 32-hour courses on utility management in seven different regional hubs. A total
 of 121 rural utility managers attended these courses. These courses were approved by the University of
 Alaska for credit and are presented in conjunction with regional health corporations and other regional
 entities.

Land Management

- Signed documents to resolve the ANCSA 14(C)(3) conveyance obligations to the state for Igiugig.
- Completed land transactions of existing trust land in 22 different communities. These land transactions made trust land available for community development projects such as public facilities, housing and airport facility expansion.
- Coordinated a public/private partnership to finalize digital orthophoto maps in 19 rural communities. The
 division continues to coordinate efforts with agencies and rural groups to produce standardized community
 profile maps for the public. The maps are an important planning tool to help expedite infrastructure
 development and encourage economic development.
- Floodplain Management/National Flood Insurance program (NFIP) staff provided technical assistance to the following communities: Anchorage, Dillingham, Eagle, Emmonak, Fairbanks North Star Borough, Hoonah, Kotzebue, Mat-Su Borough, McGrath, Nenana, Nome, Northwest Arctic Borough, Petersburg, Seward, Shishmaref, and Togiak.

Financial Assistance

- Over \$34 million was distributed to communities in FY10 under Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT), National Forest Receipts (NFR), Fisheries Business Tax and the Fisheries Landing Tax programs
- The grants section administers 1,800 grants under 12 different state and federal programs with a total value of approximately \$1.2 billion dollars, this is over double the amount from the previous year. The number of grants also increased 69% over the previous year, and grant administrator workloads are now 200 grants.
- Three new fisheries related grant or distribution programs, totaling \$6.4 million, were enacted. Funding for the programs comes from the federal government through the Department of Fish and Game. All three programs required adoption of new regulations.

Information Resources

- Research and Analysis (R&A) maintained and updated information of several extremely popular web-based products including the Community database, Capital Project database, Community Funding database, Community Photo Library, and Municipal Contact Information.
- Published a bi-monthly Lien Watch report This report documents liens, primarily due to unpaid payroll tax liabilities, that were recorded in the state recorder's office. It is widely requested and used by agencies in determining qualifications of entities for financial assistance.
- Collected and published the bi-annual report on fuel prices across Alaska, and began discussions with the Cooperative Extension Service to jointly expand the number of communities included in the report.

Office of the State Assessor

- Completed full value determinations for 40 municipal governments (17 boroughs and 23 cities), and published the information in the Alaska Taxable.
- Recalibrated five taxing models, updating standardized variable cost data, performed benchmark testing, and distributed to taxing jurisdictions for implementation.

Local Boundary Commission

• Annexation petition by the city of Fairbanks was received and processed. The annexation was ultimately approved by the Commission and submitted to the Legislature for review.
