# **Priority Programs - Key Performance Indicators**

## **Economic Growth**

- 963 permanent jobs were created or retained in Alaska by Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority financing in FY10, exceeding the target of 500.
- The value of Alaska seafood exports to Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute program destination countries decreased by 5.9% from 2008 to 2009, not meeting the target of a 0.5% increase.
- Tourism's five-year, 30% growth to over 1.7 million summer visitors showed a slight 0.4% decrease in 2008, followed by another 7.27% decrease in 2009.
- 652 jobs were created or maintained in the Alaska commercial fishing industry by utilizing the Commercial Fishing Revolving Loan Fund, exceeding the FY2010 goal of 450.
- 38 jobs in rural Alaska were created or maintained utilizing the Rural Development Initiative and Small Business Economic Development Ioan funds in FY2010, 52 fewer jobs than targeted.
  - In-state spending by Alaska Aerospace Corporation totaled \$15.2 million in FY10; this is an 11% increase of in-state spending from FY09.

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#### Sustainable Energy

As of August 2010, the proportion of electricity generated from renewable sources continues to be estimated at 24%. An updated estimate is expected in December 2010.

#### **Strong Communities**

- In FY10, 96% of municipal governments were estimated to have provided essential public services, an increase of 5% over the prior year.
- 25% reduction in the number of communities that are not compliant with management sustainability indicators, significantly surpassing the 5% reduction goal for FY10.
- Alaska ranks fifth in the nation on service and volunteerism.
- 98.99% of communities qualified for financial resource programs in FY10; an increase of 6.97% from FY09.

#### **Consumer Protection**

- No domestic insurance companies became insolvent during FY10.
- .63% decline in the number of commercial and professional services licenses from 114,307 in FY09 to 113,588 in FY10; reducing the choice consumers have in selecting a licensed provider.
- In FY10, 100% of the Regulatory Commission final orders in adjudicatory dockets were reviewed by an assistant attorney general and 100% of the final decisions were issued on or before the statutory deadline.

### Major Activities to Advance Strategies

## **Key Department Challenges**

### **Economic Development - Challenges**

<u>Division of Economic Development</u> – A key challenge is to organize a comprehensive approach to shaping state and regional activities into a cohesive statewide effort to stimulate the economy. Several state agencies have a piece of the effort or the raw data necessary to obtain meaningful industry information. There are also significant disparities in economic development opportunities among Alaska regions due to the lack of rural infrastructure and the high cost of doing business in those areas. Further, revenue streams from tourism, fisheries, and taxes are declining and there is potential for Oil & Gas opportunities to overwhelm other economic opportunities.

Historically, DED's narrow focus on specific industry sectors translated to minimum engagement with the business community. To impact the business community, DED needs to broaden its focus and engage as an active partner with the private sector, the public and other economic development entities.

<u>Qualified Trade Association Contract</u> – Concerns about the global economy affect many consumers' ability and interest to travel for vacation purposes. Research shows that consumers are traveling less, are not using all their vacation time, are traveling closer to home and personal savings are lower than the previous generation. These trends do not bode well for Alaska long-haul travel.

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<u>Alaska Aerospace Corporation</u> – The Kodiak Launch Complex (KLC) requires a source for sustainment funding. In the past, the Missile Defense Agency (MDA) has provided sustainment funding but the contract vehicle concluded on August 31, 2010. Annual sustainment funding will enable AAC to capture a market share of competitively bid launches by making KLC cost competitive with other launch facilities.

<u>Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority</u> – Continued constriction in the secondary capital markets and increased economic challenges with the resultant increase in businesses seeking funding from both the Development Finance and Loan Participation programs. In addition, there is an increasing need to attract and evaluate diverse economic development projects for the state.

<u>Alaska Energy Authority</u> – Fuel issues throughout Alaska and the shortage of natural gas in southcentral Alaska continue to challenge the agency. AEA will also be challenged with the design and fieldwork on the large Railbelt hydroelectric project. In addition, the construction of substantial infrastructure projects in the villages (for example: water/sewer facilities and school upgrades and replacements) are over-taxing some of the older power systems which results in system overload, shorter equipment life and more frequent power outages. Without remote monitoring, technical assistance and periodic training, performance and efficiency gains of newly upgraded powerhouses slowly erodes over time.

<u>Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute</u> – The global economic downturn is the biggest challenge for the Alaska seafood industry at this time. Tight credit markets have a negative impact on Alaska Seafood customers and on suppliers holding inventory. The seafood industry is suffering from reduced seafood sales at restaurants and retail grocery stores in the U.S. and overseas as consumers tighten their belts. The falling U.S. dollar value makes Alaska Seafood products more competitively priced in foreign markets, but reduces the buying power of promotional dollars expended overseas.

## **Strong Communities - Challenges**

<u>Community and Regional Affairs</u> – Sustainability of communities is a major issue due to: 1) increasing operating costs for major budget items such as transportation and insurance, 2) staff turnover as residents migrate to seek higher paying jobs, and 3) the potential for reduction in federal funding to communities. The division expects increases in technical assistance and financial intervention requests to continue as communities seek to address these issues. Funding available to local governments, from either locally generated sources, state and federal shared revenue or grants needs to maximize efficiencies and provide services to residents.

<u>Serve Alaska</u> – As new programs are established the challenge is to provide the technical assistance to the programs to ensure their compliance, and to meet the administrative standards required by the funding source with the current number of staff.

### **Consumer Protection - Challenges**

<u>Banking and Securities</u> – Staff recruitment and retention continue to be major challenges. Current financial crises will spur investor scams and litigation. The state needs to provide outreach and education to investors and be ready to sanction and prosecute those who break the law.

Insurance – Over 36,000 licensees at the end of FY10 is an increase of 60% over 2005. The increase in licensees strains the already limited resources. Appeals of denied license suspensions or revocations, and other licensing matters consume an enormous amount of staff time and effort. Limited technology resources also limit the development and implementation of solutions for the division, businesses and the public.

<u>Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing</u> – The division continues the process of overhauling and enhancing many of its automated systems and processes for efficiency and improved services for consumers. Although great strides have been made in systems and processes, work needs to continue. Some systems are antiquated or cumbersome and less 'user friendly' than desired for the public and staff.

<u>Regulatory Commission of Alaska</u> – The challenge is to continue to attract and retain qualified professional staff, administrative law judges and Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) Commissioners. Industry representatives urge the resolution of matters and the issuance of a greater percentage of decisions in advance of statutory timelines.

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# Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2012

### **Economic Development – Changes**

Division of Economic Development – Administrative Order No. 257 created the Division of Economic Development (DED) to strengthen the department's economic development function and better position DED to engage with the business community, the public and other economic development entities. This change facilitates a realignment of the organization based on economic development functions: Marketing, Finance, Research, Business Technical Assistance, and Outreach & Coordination. Funds requested for FY12 will continue to broaden and enhance DED's capacity to address business retention and expansion, do aggressive outreach to business communities to forge public/private partnerships, remove barriers to growth, and integrate and leverage State Brand investments.

<u>Qualified Trade Association Contract</u> – With continued funding from the State of Alaska, material changes to results are expected. Notably, heightened interest in Alaska travel will be driven by new television commercials scheduled to run on seven national cable networks. An example of a predicted change in results is 100,000 additional individual consumer responses are expected. Projected conversion rates are forecast to rebound after experiencing a decline starting in 2009.

<u>Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority</u> – In line with the strategic plan, funding of a financial analyst will allow for the review, analysis and evaluation of economic development projects, and increased outreach into rural and interior Alaska. In FY12, over ten projects will be in various levels of review. In order to fulfill AIDEA's mission and vision in FY12, AIDEA will implement the initiatives to:

- Diversify and grow AIDEA's assets
- Add targeted new economic development financing tools
- Expand the deployment and impact of AIDEA's economic development financing and specialty financing
- Increase its ability to provide financial and business feasibility analysis of needed economic development infrastructure for the State of Alaska.

<u>Alaska Energy Authority</u> – Development of the Emerging Energy Technology Fund program to promote the expansion of energy sources available to Alaskans.

### **Strong Communities - Changes**

<u>Community and Regional Affairs</u> – Continuation of a Resource Specialist II will provide communities with assistance for ANCSA 14(c) actions including land management, site control verification, and planning assistance services. Site control and land status verifications are needed to ensure clear title on village corporation land. Lack of this verification can result in legal issues and can hold up capital grants disbursement.

## Major Department Accomplishments in 2010

### **Economic Development - Accomplishments**

<u>Division of Economic Development</u> – Established a new focus on business outreach, retention and expansion to facilitate economic growth including:

- First-time Alaska presence at Cruise Shipping Miami 2010, Vancouver Cruise 360, and at Pacific North West Economic Region Olympic event
- Public/private partnership "Connect Alaska" that will help close the digital divide through detailed broadband "gap" mapping across Alaska
- Preparation towards a 150 tonnes large scale seed potato export from Delta Junction and the Mat-Su Valley
- 2010 Alaska showcase that connected 48 Made in Alaska vendors and 19 Alaskan and national buyers
  resulting in national vendor relationships for Alaskan products
- Twenty-four film productions prequalified for tax credits, and four productions approved for tax credits of \$244,546
- 268 loans totaling \$20.3 million in aviation, business and rural development, bulk fuel, and fisheries.

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<u>Qualified Trade Association Contract</u> – Increased the interest in Alaska as a visitor destination on both national and international levels; and, continued to position Alaska as a year-round destination.

Alaska Aerospace Corporation – Supported the build up for the Air Force STP S-26 launch in November 2010.

<u>Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority</u> – AIDEA's Revolving Fund net assets increased by \$37.1 million in FY10. As a result of AIDEA's strong performance in FY10, the FY12 dividend will be \$29.4 million. Since FY96, AIDEA has provided the state of Alaska with over \$274 million in dividends.

<u>Alaska Energy Authority</u> – AEA and its partners prepared Alaska Energy Pathway: Toward Energy Independence, released in July 2010. The Pathway contains a comprehensive database of community-specific targets and sets statewide goals for energy efficiency and renewable energy development.

<u>Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute</u> – Gained newspaper, magazine, radio, television and internet exposure for Alaska Seafood in U.S. and key overseas markets. Preliminary results indicate that in 2010 ASMI's Alaska Pavilion exhibit at the European Seafood Exposition, one of many trade show activities during the year, generated on-site sales by participating Alaska seafood companies amounting to \$48,570,000. Projected sales for the ensuing 12 months are expected to reach \$500,650,000.

#### **Strong Communities - Accomplishments**

<u>Community and Regional Affairs</u> – Approximately \$1.2 billion in grants were distributed, over twice the amount of last year. Local government assistance was expanded in Kotzebue, Nome, and Juneau and trust land transactions were completed in 22 different communities. Full value determinations were completed for 40 municipal governments (17 boroughs and 23 cities).

#### **Consumer Protection - Accomplishments**

Banking and Securities – Conducted 38 examinations of depository and non-depository institutions. In addition, the division issued 38 money transmitter licenses, and 205 new mortgage licenses. The division also received written auction rate securities complaints totaling over \$240 million from Alaskan investors. The division worked with other lead states in acquiring Alaska's share of global settlements with investment firms and is finalizing the written agreements with each firm.

Insurance – Collected \$65,277,046 in premium taxes, penalties, and fees in FY10. Registered 26 purchasing groups, admitted 28 new insurance companies, 14 new surplus lines insurers and five risk retention groups.

<u>Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing</u> – Significant improvements were made to divisional processing systems for corporation registrations, filings, and renewals. Improvements resulted in reductions in response time from 14 weeks to two weeks or less in the handling of applications and other required corporate transactions. Other system improvements include a new Investigative Case Management tracking system and online renewal capabilities for programs not currently available. Benefits of these improvements include ease of use by licensees in the application or renewal process and information handling by staff.

<u>Regulatory Commission of Alaska</u> – Reduced potential for widespread winter power shortages by approving five natural gas supply contracts between utility service providers and natural gas suppliers. The commission also adopted net metering regulations which facilitate small scale renewable generation by electric customers. These regulations make it easier for certain electric consumers to reduce their load requirement by interconnecting on-site generation facilities to electric utility facilities.

<u>Serve Alaska</u> – AmeriCorps members served 300,934 hours in meeting critical community needs in education, public safety, health and the environment.
