Department of Law Environmental Law Component Budget Summary

Component: Environmental Law

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Environmental Section provides advice and representation to several agencies, including primarily the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), to assist them in the performance of their duties related to environmental matters. The section's representation includes enforcement and recovery of costs and damages as well as defense of the state with respect to its role in a contaminated site or in carrying out its regulatory function.

Core Services

- Contaminated sites: In consultation with DEC, department attorneys pursue appropriate enforcement actions
 against responsible parties to ensure cleanup at contaminated sites or recommend to DEC that the state initiate a
 state led cleanup. In either case, the department pursues appropriate reimbursement of any state cleanup
 expenditures.
- Contaminated sites: The department consults with DEC in decisions to release a potentially responsible party from liability when available evidence indicates that the party is not, in fact, liable. Department attorneys work with DEC to negotiate prospective purchaser agreements for contaminated sites when appropriate.
- Oil spill prevention and response: The department advises and defends DEC regarding oil spill contingency plan
 approvals. When spills occur, investigative, enforcement, and litigation services are provided to ensure that the
 response is prompt and complete, that state costs and damages are reimbursed, and that violations of law are
 assigned fair consequences. Advice is provided with respect to the prevention and amelioration of fuel oil spills
 from above and underground storage tanks.
- Air and water quality: The department advises DEC regarding air permits and brings enforcement actions against
 entities violating clean air laws. The department provides advice on water quality issues including permitting for
 large mines, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) primacy, marine vessel wastewater
 discharges, domestic wastewater, and drinking water. Advice is provided to the Village Safe Water program on a
 variety of issues related to that program.
- Coastal Management Program: The Department advises the Department of Natural Resources on matters
 relating to the Alaska Coastal Management Program (ACMP) and the performance of the agency's duties under
 that program.
- Public health: The department provides legal advice to DEC's Division of Environmental Health on public health issues, such as food safety, animal health, and pesticides.
- Homeland security: The department provides legal advice to various state officials regarding efforts to improve security of critical facilities, such as the TransAlaska Pipeline and drinking water supplies.
- Legal defense of state actions: The environmental law component defends state agencies and officials when they are sued for the performance of their duties. These include cleanup decisions, issuance of permits, approval of contingency plans, consistency determinations and other matters.

Key Component Challenges

- Litigate civil case against British Petroleum Exploration (Alaska) Inc. to recover civil assessments, penalties, costs, and damages to the State, including lost revenues, as a result of the 2006 oil spills from pipeline corrosion and the resulting 2006-08 partial shutdown of the Prudhoe Bay field.
- Resolve the Exxon Valdez oil spill reopener issue.
- Assist DEC in implementing state primacy in NPDES permitting.
- Hold the federal government accountable for non-compliance with state and federal environmental laws.
- Provide legal advice relating to ACMP program changes and ABC list revisions and defend challenges to district plan revisions.
- Assist DEC with continued implementation of Ballot Measure 2 (the "Cruise Ship Initiative") approved by the

voters in the August 2006 primary elections.

- Defend challenges to DEC contingency plan decisions and develop oil spill prevention regulations.
- Help develop new regulations for DEC.
- Defend constitutional challenge to the Department of Natural Resource's regulatory process for issuance of miscellaneous land use permits and temporary land use permits.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2012

No changes are anticipated.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2010

In FY 2010, the section recovered \$3,854,331 for state costs and penalties related to violations of state environmental laws and obtained cleanup agreements with polluters with an estimated value of over \$4,100,000 for a total benefit to the state of over \$7,954.331. To obtain this money the Department expended \$1.7 million. Some examples of the work done by the Department that protects public health and safety are as follows:

- BP Exploration Secondary Containment Violations. Department lawyers worked with the Industry Preparedness Section of DEC's Division of Spill Prevention and Response on an enforcement action against BP Exploration (Alaska) Inc. (BPXA) for tank secondary containment violations at the Greater Prudhoe Bay, Endicott and Badami oil facilities on the North Slope. As a result of inspections conducted by DEC in October 2007, three secondary containment areas were found to be inadequate in size to hold the contents of the largest oil storage tank or the tank truck using the loading facility. In addition, the containment areas were significantly smaller than represented to DEC in BPXA's approved Oil Discharge Prevention and Contingency Plan. As part of the negotiation of a Compliance Order by Consent (COBC), BPXA undertook an audit of its North Slope Facilities and identified sixteen additional secondary containment areas that were undersized either because they had not been maintained over time or because they were too small as originally constructed. Under the COBC, signed in August 2009, BPXA agreed to repair the secondary containments and loading areas and has completed the repair of almost all of the facilities. The remainder of the repair work will be completed in 2010. BPXA also paid civil assessments under AS 46.03.760(a) of \$1,709,498 to reimburse the State's costs of investigation and negotiation of the COBC and to recoup BPXA's economic savings in not meeting the secondary containment requirement as required by DEC's spill prevention requirements and BPXA's approved oil spill contingency plan.
- Tanker Seabulk Pride Grounding. Department lawyers concluded an enforcement action brought by the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) against Seabulk Tankers, Inc. and Tesoro Alaska Co. concerning the oil spill and grounding of the tanker Seabulk Pride on February 2, 2006. The Department concluded a settlement in June 2010 that addressed civil oil spill claims and alleged violations of Tesoro's Cook Inlet Oil Discharge Prevention and Contingency Plan. Seabulk and Tesoro paid the state \$429,870, including an oil spill civil assessment of \$5,000, civil assessments of \$360,000 for violations Tesoro's oil spill contingency plan, and \$64,870 in reimbursement of the state's response and investigation costs. Tesoro has agreed to produce a video at a cost of at least \$35,000 to train mariners in Cook Inlet on ice hazards during winter operations. In addition to the settlement, Tesoro and Seabulk have made improvements in their Cook Inlet operations. They include significant upgrades to the Kenai Pipeline dock mooring line tension monitoring system, providing tankers at the dock with direct access to the tension data on dedicated laptops. Tesoro has also stationed a specialty tug at the dock during winter ice conditions.
- Alaska Community Action on Toxics et. al. v. Commissioner Larry Hartig. The Department successfully defended
 against a Temporary Restraining Order (TRO)/Preliminary Injunction action seeking to enjoin a DEC pesticide
 spraying permit issued to the Alaska Railroad Corporation.
- <u>Nunamta Aulukestai, et. al. v. DNR.</u> The Department successfully defended against a TRO/Preliminary Injunction action seeking to enjoin DNR permits authorizing mineral exploration and temporary water use at the Pebble Project.
- Rural water and sewer projects. The Department assisted DEC with the development of statutory and regulatory revisions that enable DEC to obtain and administer economic stimulus (American Recovery and Reinvestment

Act) grant funding for construction activities that will enhance infrastructure availability and capacity for drinking water and sanitary sewage systems throughout the state. As a result of our section's work, DEC now has the authority to issue and administer both grants and loans under the drinking water and clean water funds. Approximately \$43.0 million has been made available and loans are currently being administered under the Alaska Drinking Water Fund (\$19.5 million) and the Alaska Clean Water Fund (\$23.5 million). Over half of the available funds have been spent.

<u>Air quality.</u> The Department appealed EPA's Endangerment Finding triggering federal requirements for states to regulate of Green House Gases under the Clean Air Act. It is anticipated that the court will set a briefing schedule later this year.

Working with ADEC Air Division, Department lawyers negotiated a COBC with the Alaska Railroad and Aurora Energy related to fugitive dust emissions at the Seward Coal Terminal, which included \$214,000 for civil penalties, enhanced dust control measures, stipulated penalties, and payment of all ADEC and DOL costs and expenses related to the enforcement action.

- Section 402, 404 Federal Claims. Working with DOL Transportation Section attorneys, and representing the
 Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities, the component helped DOT&PF negotiate the settlement
 of a complex Clean Water Act enforcement action with the US Dept of Justice and US EPA which concluded in
 late May of this year, following three years of settlement discussions.
- <u>BP Pipeline Spills.</u> The component is litigating an action against BPXA to recover penalties and damages suffered due to the 2006 BP pipeline spills and shutdowns.
- Alaska Coast Management Plan (ACMP). The component had significant responsibility for providing legal advice for important coastal management issues, including development of ACMP program changes, district plan amendments, and revision of the ABC List.
- Clean Water Act, Department lawyers played a key role with DEC in developing a program and an extensive regulation project as part of the state's application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for primacy of the NPDES Program under the Clean Water Act. The Department assisted with legislation needed to meet program requirements for federal approval. State primacy in this area will result in faster permitting decisions that are more accurately based on local conditions.
- Cleanup of Contaminated Federal Sites. The component assisted DEC in prompting the Bureau of Land Management to re-initiate its efforts at fully characterizing and remediating Red Devil Mine, heavily contaminated with mercury from historic ore processing.
- The State has re-focused on an historic petroleum release in Kotzebue adjacent to the Kotzebue Sound. The release is believed to have occurred in the 1950's and 60's, from a school and hospital owned/operated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Indian Health Services. The State has called for a potentially responsible parties meeting in Kotzebue to have the parties move forward with characterization of the release.
- Regulations. The component assisted DEC in a number of regulations projects.
