This is Phase 2 of a third five-year replacement cycle of the computer, server and printer replacement project. The agency objective is to replace personal computers, printers, servers, network attached storage and supporting devices such as Uninterruptible Power Supplies (UPS) that have exceeded their useful life. With 274 computers in use within the division, a five year replacement plan has 55 computers in that situation, as well as several servers and duplex printers.

Project Description/Justification:

What is the purpose of the project?

The agency objective is to replace personal computers, printers, servers, network attached storage and supporting devices such as Uninterruptible Power Supplies (UPS) that have exceeded their useful life.

The division will use the \$212,000 to purchase hardware (55 PCs, 5 servers, 8 printers, 2 laptops and 3 UPS.

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What will happen if the project is not approved?

The alternative is to continue maintaining older computer equipment. Cost of servicing existing older computer equipment is generally more expensive than replacing the equipment. Customer satisfaction may decrease if wait times to complete requests take longer to accomplish as a result of waiting for equipment repairs. There may be an inability to provide new functionality due to older hardware limitations.
