Project Description/Justification:

The Palmer Correction Center (PCC) was constructed in phases between 1973 and 1995 and contains 180,000 square feet of space. This project will provide the following currently identified maintenance at the PCC:

These projects are from a compilation of essential capital requirements at this institution. A list of known projects is formulated in late October or early November each year. The actual list of projects is fluid between the time that the list is prepared and the time the appropriation is authorized. During

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this time period, other critical projects are identified with several of the already identified projects being completed. Funds are then allocated to the most urgent of the remaining projects. The projects that could not be accomplished become the basis of the next fiscal year capital appropriation request.
