Contribution to Department's Mission

Provide confinement and a cultural overlay program within communities to offenders that are committed to the custody of the department.

Core Services

- Contract Offender Confinement
- Behavioral Intervention

Key Component Challenges

Community Residential Center (CRC) beds are a cost-effective means of providing correctional services under supervision to offenders who are preparing to re-enter the community freeing-up hard beds in the correctional facilities for serious, violent offenders.

It is a constant challenge to identify offenders who are appropriate for placement into CRC's. The offender population must be closely monitored to maximize utilization of all CRC beds.

Expanding programs at the CRC's to provide the tools that lead to successful reintegration of offenders back into the communities.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2013

No changes in results delivered.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2011

The Department of Corrections placed 8,345 offenders into Community Residential Center (CRC) beds and successfully discharged 6,937 out of the CRC and into the community.

A total of 185,507 community work service (CWS) hours were performed. CWS is performed for non-profit organizations such as the Senior Center, the Food Bank of Alaska, Catholic Community Services, the Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation, and Lutheran Social Services.
