Major Activities to Advance Strategies

- Continue audits and security inspections of facilities.

- Recommend education conditions to the court and Parole Board for offenders lacking a high school diploma.
- Verify restitution with Court System and Department of Law.

- Monitor and promote offenders' restitution payments.
- Verify completion of community work service.
- Provide referral to employment and employment services.
- Provide referrals to adult education.

Key RDU Challenges

Reduce the ongoing deterioration of the facilities.

Manage fluctuating energy costs for heating oil, natural gas, and electricity; and, the subsequent impact on commodity costs (food, medical supplies, etc).

Increase number of applicants for special medical, discretionary, and early parole termination. Provide orientation to both institutional and field probation officers to expand the number of applicants for housing assistance under the Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Program in the following communities: Fairbanks, Kenai, Homer, Juneau, Ketchikan, Kodiak, Petersburg, Sitka, Soldotna, Valdez, Wasilla, Palmer, and Wrangell.

Complete annual comprehensive overview and reviews of each institution's function and adherence to current policies and procedures.

Supervise offenders according to their risk and address criminogenic needs as determined by a standardized risk assessment.

Transition from limited number of institutional treatment programs to limited community based treatment options and referrals including halfway house beds, sex offender treatment programs and treatment providers, and residential substance abuse treatment programs. Make decisions that release offenders on parole to viable release plans premised upon those realistically available resources.

Implementation of a strategic plan developed with assistance from the National Parole Resource Center for best practices in setting parole conditions, streamlining the violation and discretionary processes, obtaining a decision-making matrix, and use of assessment tools to target the criminogenic needs of the parolees.

Implementation of the Fairbanks PACE Domestic Violence misdemeanor pilot project.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2013

Opening Goose Creek Correctional Center, the largest correctional facility in Alaska, will be significant: Phased recruitment and training of correctional officers, probation officers, medical staff, program staff, and support staff; securing and facilitating air transports, transitioning inmates from Colorado to Alaska, and ground transports for property transition. Population management by classification will occur statewide in an effort to house offenders in the most suitable institution and geographic areas.

Major RDU Accomplishments in 2011

Completed construction of Goose Creek Correctional Center, under budget and ahead of schedule.

Completed replacement of 1966 steam boiler and distribution system at Fairbanks Correctional Center.

Continued expansion of available beds in community residential centers (halfway houses), a cost-effective population management tool.

Expanded the Anchorage Prisoner Accountability with Certain Enforcement (PACE).

Published and Distributed Alaska's 5-year Strategic Prisoner Re-Entry Plan.

Partnered with the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC), Department of Corrections (DOC) Probation & Parole, and the Alaska Board of Parole to develop and implement the Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Program to provide housing assistance for eligible tenants to enhance their successful re-entry from incarceration into the following communities: Fairbanks, Kenai, Homer, Juneau, Ketchikan, Kodiak, Petersburg, Sitka, Soldotna, Valdez, Wasilla, Palmer, and Wrangell. A total of 19 applicants have been referred to AHFC for housing assistance for the fiscal year.

Completed revision of classification and re-entry policies and began training staff on the new policies with full implementation scheduled for January 2012.

Established a Sub-Acute Mental Health Module to prepare mentally ill prisoners to function as normally as possible while incarcerated in a DOC facility in preparation of successful release back into the community, to give the department another level of treatment to match the needs of mentally ill prisoners, and to ease the overcrowding in the acute mental health module.

Implemented parole module for Alaska Corrections Offender Management System (ACOMS) database to capture parole data for statistical information to increase the responsiveness to data requests and significantly improve the decision-making process.
