Department of Labor and Workforce Development Vocational Rehabilitation Administration Component Budget Summary

#### **Component: Vocational Rehabilitation Administration**

#### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The Vocational Rehabilitation Administration component contributes to the department's mission by providing administrative support and oversight to the division's programs.

#### **Core Services**

- Set policy and provide oversight and evaluation of the activities of the division.
- Monitor grants to public and private non-profit organizations providing disabilities services.
- Identify new federal and state resources available to support the program.
- Participate in a collaborative partnership with two federally required consumer controlled councils to insure an
  effective service delivery system.

#### **Key Component Challenges**

Approximately 45 percent of the division's key management positions are held by individuals who are eligible to retire. Finding replacements for these individuals continues to be difficult because of the specialized nature of the positions and the limited pool of qualified applicants.

Ensure statutes, regulations, and program policies are reflective of current business practices and law. For example, the definition for a "person with a disability" (AS 36.30.170(k)) for the purpose of determining who is eligible for the disability preference in state procurement is difficult to administer. It requires individuals to provide medical and other information to the division for an individual determination of eligibility. Alaska statute does not allow the use of recognized determinations of permanent disability such as those made by the United States Social Security Administration or the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. Passage of HB205 would streamline the administration of the disability preference program.

Acquiring the maximum cost reimbursement allowed from the Social Security Administration (SSA) for assisting beneficiaries to obtain substantial gainful employment continues to be a challenge. The process to collect and coordinate the data from several programs outside the division to claim reimbursement is very labor intensive. The division consulted with a recognized cost-reimbursement expert from another state to determine if updated technology would expedite the process and identify cases that could be missed using our existing method. With this new information, the division plans to purchase software which will expedite the process of collecting SSA reimbursements.

The lack of medical providers willing to provide contract consultation services to Vocational Rehabilitation counselors regarding complex medical conditions result in increased costs to the program in the form of additional diagnostic medical services, longer timeframes to establish program eligibility or development of service plans.

Increasing the number of specialized community rehabilitation partners who become employment networks, and offering job retention or on-going support services continues to be a challenge. There are a limited number of providers with expertise to serve individuals with certain disabilities such as those that are deaf, blind and those that have a mental illness.

#### Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2013

No significant changes in results are anticipated.

#### **Major Component Accomplishments in 2011**

In FY2011, the Vocational Rehabilitation Administration component:

#### Component — Vocational Rehabilitation Administration

- Moved the division's Anchorage administrative office to a more central location in an effort to improve services to Anchorage staff in procurement, personnel, travel and training.
- Received an onsite review of the division's vocational rehabilitation conducted by the US Department of Education, Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA), which identified few fiscal findings that required additional follow up and no program service findings. The division's next review is scheduled for 2016.
