Department of Labor and Workforce Development New Frontier Vocational Technical Center Component Budget Summary

#### **Component: New Frontier Vocational Technical Center**

#### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The New Frontier Vocational Technical Center component contributes to the mission of the department by providing market-driven vocational and technical training in rural Alaska and by creating an environment that promotes commitment to education and career opportunities. This is a pass-through grant. The department has no authority over the management of the program, except to collect and track performance data and develop the grant agreement.

#### **Core Services**

- This component provides an Alaska Technical Vocational Education Program (TVEP AS 23.15.840) funded operating grant to the New Frontier Vocational Technical Center (NFVTC). NFVTC:
- Provides opportunities for career-related training, education, and employment skills training for individual career
  interests, and employment capabilities toward life-long productivity and self-sufficiency in our society.

#### **Key Component Challenges**

The key challenges facing the New Frontier Vocational Technical Center are:

- Ensuring a consistent level of funding to maintain the integrity of existing programs while continuing to improve the quality of training and job placement rates.
- Adapting training courses to meet industry needs, which is essential to providing job opportunities for Alaskans.
- Managing the growth resulting from a successful increased recruiting presence in Western Alaska.
- Evaluating and developing strategies to address capital investment needs for family housing options, an onsite day care presence, technology upgrades, and additional classroom, meeting and laboratory space.
- Maintaining levels of staffing needed for current programs with the increased costs for employee wage and benefits packages, which limits the ability to address new training initiatives.

#### Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2013

New Frontier has interest in adding additional course offerings in allied health careers, virtual office administration, culinary arts, early childhood development and welding. These programs are currently in the research and development stage. There is a current curriculum review underway driven by the upsurge in enrollment of Western Alaska students seeking 30+ week training programs.

#### **Major Component Accomplishments in 2011**

During FY2011, New Frontier Vocational Technical Center:

- Increased their enrollment through successful recruiting in Western Alaska. Continued market research and the development of new programs such as professional medical coding and shorter individual course offerings have served these rural students effectively. The recent increase in enrollment is also reflective of the safe, nurturing community available to New Frontier students who participate in their residence life program.
- Demonstrated continued success in their professional medical coding (PMC) program through a combination of onsite and distance education. New Frontier successfully met the training needs of students with

disabilities by providing one-on-one tutoring and developing programs especially designed to meet individual student needs.

- Amundsen Educational Center (AEC), the parent organization of New Frontier, achieved WIA eligible provider list status for its construction training program. AEC construction students can earn diplomas in residential construction or advanced residential construction. These students are building a 2700 square foot duplex on contract. The duplex is both the learning laboratory for construction education as well as a modest source of revenue for AEC.
- Developed a new classroom for PMC training and multi-use purposes, installed two new video projection units for training in the classroom and computer lab, and upgraded a few student work stations with new computers.

**Education Program** 

The Technical Vocational Education Program (TVEP) Account established in AS 23.15.830 provides funds to support technical and vocational training programs to Alaska residents.

These funds are used by the New Frontier Vocational Technical Center to upgrade instructional materials and equipment, provide program enhancement, and to develop the capacity to support industry specific training programs in order to address critical areas where there is a shortage of trained workers in the state. This funding is authorized through AS 23.15.835 and provides resources to support technical and vocational training programs to Alaska residents.

These funds are used by the New Frontier Vocational Technical Center to upgrade instructional materials and equipment, provide program enhancement, and to develop the capacity to support industry specific training programs in order to address critical areas where there is a shortage of trained workers in the state.
