University of Alaska Kodiak College Component Budget Summary

Component: Kodiak College

Contribution to Department's Mission

Kodiak College (KOC), established in 1968, is the only public institution of higher learning on Kodiak Island. Kodiak College serves the City of Kodiak, the largest U.S. Coast Guard base in the nation, and seven remote Alaska Native village communities, six of which are accessible only by boat or small plane.

The vision for Kodiak College is to be Kodiak Island's first choice as a vibrant gathering place for learners.

Core values for Kodiak College include: Diversity, Equity, Respect, Knowledge and Expertise, Lifelong learning, and Service and Engagement.

Core Services

- Offers the Associate of Arts General Program degree, which students typically use as a transfer degree to other UA campuses.
- Offers Associate of Applied Science degrees and certificates; all are fields considered to be in high demand for 21st century workers:
- -Associate of Applied Science in Technology, articulated with the Kodiak High School vocational program;
- -New program concentrations in Welding;
- · -Occupational Safety and Health;
- · -Construction Management.
- Assists qualified families in need with income tax preparation through students in the Associate of Applied Science degrees in Accounting and General Business.
- Prepares and places clerical and office workers in many of the area's businesses, nonprofits, and government
 offices through the Associate of Applied Science and occupational certificates in the Computer Information and
 Office Systems program.
- Supports the Bachelor of Elementary Education and Bachelor of Liberal Studies degrees through collaboration between Kodiak and the College of Education, UAA.
- Supports classes both on-site and through distance delivery to students seeking a baccalaureate degree in Kodiak and across the UAA campuses through a newly appointed KOC Education faculty.
- Provides support for distance education students with free public computers, audio-visual connective meeting rooms, and a consortium library with over 50,000 volumes and full access to the complete UA database online and an increasing number of distance education.
- Assists and supports current and potential students in rural communities via Rural Access Coordinators whose
 part-time salaries are split among the college, Adult Basic Education and funding from the Kodiak Island Borough.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2012

- Awarded nearly \$2 million in U.S. Department of Education Title III grant funds to develop an Alutiiq Studies and Student Services Program. New Alutiiq language courses are now being taught at Kodiak College.
- Collaborated with the Kodiak Island Borough School District in the creation of a dual-credit Health Sciences
 Academy for high school students interested in future health careers.
- Provided student with unique opportunities for learning. Biology professor, Dr. Cindy Trussell, was awarded a \$10,000 University Honors College Faculty Leadership in Expanding Undergraduate Research grant (FLEUR) that funded KOC microbiology students to undertake a Paralytic Shellfish Poisoning research project on Kodiak Island. Students were also able to participate in on-campus reconstruction of the famed salmon seiner FV Thelma C.

Kodiak expanded its role as a host for community events, such as: Rural Forums that bring together
community leaders from rural villages across the Kodiak Archipelago to discuss matters of concern to Alaska
Native leaders; the Seventh Annual Lily Arctic Conference for educators across Alaska; and an Enhanced
Threat and Risk Assessment course sponsored by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security/ Federal
Emergency Management Agency for 23 trainees representing several community and public safety
employees.

Key Component Challenges

- Acquiring \$24 million in funding for the Vocational Technical building to meet the growing demands for technical skills training.
- Acquiring funding for additional student services employees to help with dramatically increasing workload
 related to student admissions, advising, and retention. The Title III grant funded student advisor for the Alutiiq
 Studies program has made a difference already in Alaska Native student participation and retention.
- Acquiring additional funding to support the Adult and Basic Education and English as a Second Language programs.
- Addressing significant "overload" teaching assignments for high demand subject areas that results from a
 lack of qualified adjunct faculty applicants in the adjunct pool.
- Successfully addressing the increasing need for adjunct faculty to teach in specialized subjects, particularly in in high demand workforce areas.
- Address increased demands for academic advising during the summer when most instructors and the faculty academic advisor are off-contract.
- Increase availability of General Education Requirement (GER) courses to meet student demands for this
 coursework during the summer term.
- Meeting training needs of Kodiak's expanding seafood industry, which is Kodiak's second largest employment sector (30%) that grew by 12.5% from 1,606 employees in 2010 to 1,806 employees in 2011.
- Determining how to best serve Kodiak's expanding "Shipyard" that is promoting the increased capacity of its boat service and repair facilities, and new boat lift on St. Herman's Harbor.
- Acquiring funding to develop Phase II of our Path One "Fast Track" training and scheduling program for "sustainable" construction workforce development courses (e.g., alternative building materials, building for solar energy).
- Determining any indirect effects the delayed expansion of the Kodiak Launch Complex may have on the College.
- Determining any indirect or direct effects the cutback on federal SBA (a) contracting by Alaska Native Regional and Alaska Native Village corporations may have on the College.
- Determining the direct effect that tuition increase caps will have upon the college.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2014

- Construction preparation for the proposed Vocational Education building that includes a lengthy disruption to campus life.
- A Student Success Coordinator and administrative associate will be hired to oversee the College's tutoring program, college preparation courses, and assist with academic advising during the main school year.
- Delivery of specific allied health courses and distant learning labs in collaboration with WICHE and community college grant partners.
- Welding students will be involved with "hands-on" training opportunities on community service and other industry projects.
- "Path One: Fast Track Carpentry and Weatherization" program will be initiated in spring semester 2013. In this pilot program, students will earn Level 1, Level 2 NCCER (National Center for Construction Education and Research) carpentry certifications and NCCER Weatherization certification in one,15-week semester. This is a direct response to community workforce demand.
