University of Alaska Ketchikan Campus Component Budget Summary

## **Component: Ketchikan Campus**

### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The UAS Ketchikan Campus is an important component of the regional structure of the University of Alaska Southeast. At the Ketchikan Campus, students can earn occupational endorsements, certificate and associate degrees. The campus plays a critical role in providing a wide range of eLearning upper- and lower-level general education requirement courses that support the Bachelor of Liberal Arts degree across the region. Professors are innovative in using technology to blend on-campus classes with eLearning course offerings. The Ketchikan Campus is a significant resource for the community and surrounding region offering programs relevant to the workforce in Southern Southeast Alaska.

### **Core Services**

- Ketchikan is a branch campus of the University of Alaska Southeast regional university, and as such, is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities
- Ketchikan provides UAS' highly-successful marine transportation program, offering certifications and licensure
  needed by Alaska's maritime workforce in fisheries and marine transportation. The campus also provides training
  for fisheries technicians, and it offers a welding program important to marine industries. Ketchikan is a key player
  in distance delivery education, especially for lower division general education courses.
- Ketchikan provides associate degrees and certificates and acts as a "feeder" to University baccalaureate programs.
- Ketchikan offers postsecondary academic and workforce training programs in two distinct areas of emphasis: two-year general education local and distance programs; and workforce development programs.
- Ketchikan prepares students for transfer to four-year institutions, delivers courses and programs in response to
  local community workforce needs, provides certificate and associate degrees in relevant career-oriented training
  programs, and provides high quality distance education support.
- The Ketchikan campus provides credit and non-credit courses for the benefit of citizens in the community, including classes in Alaska native languages, Northwest Coastal Art, and music and art.
- Ketchikan also supports students with counseling, advising, and library and learning center services.

## **Major Component Accomplishments in 2012**

### **During FY2012 the Ketchikan Campus:**

- Increased student headcount by 15.6% (1,321 in FY 2012) and graduated 60% more students (24 in FY2012) from Ketchikan Campus programs than FY2011
- Implemented online tutoring services to distance students
- Obtained permanent funding for full time faculty positions in Marine and Fisheries Technology
- Reallocated internal funding for a full time faculty position with advising responsibilities for the BLA eLearning delivered program
- Obtained private sector funding for a Fisheries Technology Coordinator
- State of Alaska for licenses, upgrades, and certifications
- Reaffirmed partnership with the USDA Forest Service to provide two archaeologists and logistical support for archaeological field school for UAS Ketchikan students conducted in southern southeast Alaska.
- Partnered with the Ketchikan Gateway Borough School District to provide an introduction to college life for students from Ketchikan and Craig High Schools
- Partnered with the Southeast Alaska Building Association, Job Service, and other local agencies for Ketchikan Construction Academy training.
- Renewed partnership with local health care agencies to provide clinical instruction and support for the Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) and Registered Nurse (RN) programs.
- Established Memorandums of Understanding with Ketchikan Indian Community and Sitka Sound Science Center
  to facilitate implementation of collaborative projects related to education, undergraduate research, and workforce
  development.
- Continued partnerships with the Alaska Marine Highway System, United States Coast Guard, Alaska Vocational

Education Center, Southern Southeast Alaska Building Industry Association, Ketchikan General Hospital, Oceans Alaska and Alaska Ship and Dry Dock.

- Developed and implemented internships in Information Technology with local agencies such as Ketchikan Indian Community which resulted in permanent employment for students.
- Developed articulation agreements with Prince William Sound Community College, Kodiak College, and UAF Bristol Bay Campus to jointly deliver the AAS and Certificate in Fisheries Technology.

## **Key Component Challenges**

The Ketchikan campus faces a number of challenges in its effort to ensure that it provides high quality postsecondary education to a diverse student body of both on-campus and eLearning students. Most of these challenges are related to the limitations on size of faculty, size of the local community, losses in population, and its remote location.

The Ketchikan campus has focused on eLearning course development in general education requirements for associate and baccalaureate programs, as well as upper division social science classes for students in the eLearning delivered Bachelor of Liberal Arts (BLA) program. Challenges remain in identifying and recruiting adjunct faculty to expand the depth and breadth of course work that the Ketchikan campus can support and deliver.

Additionally, the Ketchikan campus continues to expand its student services in eLearning tutoring support, faculty advising, and other innovative support, to better accommodate the needs of distance students; continuous training and development in the field of eLearning technologies is an on-going challenge. The campus also struggles with having sufficient resources necessary to support the delivery of business courses and training requested by the local community.

The lack of financial aid available to students is a challenge with workforce programs.. Some entry-level programs don't qualify for financial aid and limited scholarships exist for workforce training and education. Additionally, workforce programs tend to be intense courses which require students to be in class all day, limiting their ability to work and adding to student financial strains.

Adequate space is a challenge the Ketchikan campus faces in terms of program development and expansion. It lacks the facilities and equipment to provide instructional services requested by local industry. This has led to foregoing provision of these services and/or outsourcing to other locales. The Ketchikan campus has enjoyed federal Title III funding because of its service to nearby Alaska Native populations. Through Title III funds, the campus has been able to expand in certain areas, specifically in the area of marine transportation. Moreover, Ketchikan was successful in securing \$500,000 in funding for a marine transportation outdoor training platform. However, in order to fully develop the marine transportation program, additional facilities are needed to expand this program to meet industry needs. Limited office space also provides a challenge in supporting logistical needs of adjunct faculty, who need to meet with students.

It is important to note that the Ketchikan campus serves a different student demographic than traditional university campuses. The average Ketchikan student is female, in her late twenties, and is taking courses part-time. On this campus 92% of students enrolled are less than full-time and over 75% test into remedial Math and English. These nontraditional, part-time students require more support services to persist to completion over a longer period of time. Ketchikan is meeting this challenge with the help of Title III funding to expand its eLearning support for students and the innovative use of social media; however, continued funding for this specialized support needs to be obtained.

## Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2014

UAS positions and programs are stationed on particular campuses, but their impacts are felt region and statewide. Faculty and administration serve in region-wide roles to support the Institution's educational mission and the goals set forth in the University of Alaska Strategic Direction Initiative.
