This project will construct safety walkways along Boniface Parkway between Debarr Road and 22nd Avenue related to vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists.

*Funding Details:**2010 state grant for \$100,000.***Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

This project will construct safety walkways along Boniface Parkway between Debarr Road and 22nd Avenue related to vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists.

A 2010 state grant funded initial design which is underway. State grant funding is proposed for design since Boniface is a state-owned route. Construction is anticipated in 2015 depending on the availability of funding. Pedestrian facilities are missing on the west side of Boniface Parkway between DeBarr Road and Northern Lights Boulevard. This project is identified in the Anchorage Pedestrian Plan.

The grant funding may be used for planning, design, utility work, obtaining rights of way and easements, construction, and any work associated with the improvements described above or associated amenities.

**Project Timeline:**

Design expenditures will occur in 2015 and 2016. Construction expense is anticipated in 2016 and 2017.
