



Russian Jack Community Council supports the following items from the Anchorage Park Foundation 2013 legislative requests:

1. Wonder Park corridor - \$25,000 to improve the safety of the pathway between Russian Jack Springs Park and Wonder Park Elementary School.

2. Dave Rose Park - \$168,000 to make neighborhood park safety upgrades. This is to clear overgrowth in forested areas, increase lighting, replace broken benches and tables, replace wooden playground equipment and make the facility less susceptible to permanent graffiti.
