Detailed Project Description and Justification:

The Community Park, consisting of ball fields, picnic areas, recreation and playground equipment is a centerpiece for local residents and visitors alike. Activity remains busy during the summer months. The four (4) current "wooden stalls" have outlived their useful time and replacing them with modern vault toilets will reduce maintenance and provide sanitary amenities with American Disabilities Compliant designs for the community. The vault toilet facilities would be similar to the design used by Alaska State Parks.

Access into and around the Community Park on asphalt paths would accommodate strollers and wheelchairs better than the current gravel paths. As the park usage increases each year the requests for better access have increased. The previously paved pathways in the Deltana Fairgrounds have had the desired effect and improved pedestrian access.

Good day Pete,

At last night's council meeting we revised our capital list. This list is in order of priority. A brief description of each. A more descriptive narrative will be included with the final submittal.

Disaster Readiness: This is a carryover from last year. A 100KW generator, to operate the City Hall, Library and Community Center in case of an emergency. The Community Center is a Red Cross shelter. Includes a generator building, electrical distribution lines, and 72 hours of fuel supply.

Community Park: Two public restroom buildings; one near the playground and the other near the little league ball fields. Accessible asphalt paths for mobility within the park. Currently they are gravel. A vocal community request.

Area Transportation: This includes light survey work to establish grade elevation, adding several inches of gravel to our streets, asphalt paving for 3-4 streets, and similar work on our city runway.

Streets: A replacement motor grader for maintenance of our streets. The current grader is 33 years old.

Landfill: A replacement wheel loader used to move public trash containers and make daily cover material (gravel) by screening through the grizzly.
