#### **Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

This Project Will Provide:

- Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) that protect firefighters engaged in firefighting and hazmat response that meet the new, more stringent, requirements of NFPA's 2013 edition of SCBA standards.
- Purchase of resources such as axes, Halligan tools, hand saws, reciprocating saws, power saws, nozzles, firefighting hose, firefighting foam, specialty equipment, hazmat response equipment, AEDs, and basic life support medical equipment.
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for firefighters to have during response to emergencies.
- Reduce the risks and dangers inherent in responders using aged and outdated equipment and tools.
- Save lives, property, and engage in environmental conservation with appropriate protection for responders.

#### Justification:

- Safety of responders is paramount to success at any emergency scene
- PPE currently owned and used by Houston Fire Department is over 5 years old, and have already received numerous repairs to keep them in service because of insufficient funds to purchase new gear.
- Aged equipment results in increased risk and occurrence of injuries both at training and on scenes.
- All SCBA airpacks are no longer in compliance with NFPA standard for firefighters. This is a critical safety need.
- Provide PPE to be available for responders that actually fit, instead of the current system of finding gear that is close to the responders' sizes.
- The City of Houston does not have the funds for the project, and in the past, along with other local fire departments, has received State assistance for similar requests.
