Detailed Project Description and Justification:

Denali Borough residents requiring emergency medical care must often be transported to Fairbanks to either Fairbanks Memorial Hospital or Bassett Army Hospital. The Borough seeks to reduce the number of these trips using the existing ambulances -- one a 2002 vehicle with 72,000 miles and a 2006 vehicle with 60,000 miles -- both of which are equipped primarily to provide first response across a wide range of difficult road conditions in the Borough. These ambulances are very heavy and are costly to operate. A smaller, more fuel efficient, primarily highway-capable ambulance could save considerably on energy costs.

Dear Denali Borough Assembly Member

The Tri-Valley Volunteer Fire Department is applying for legislative funds to purchase a new "van type" ambulance that will be better suited for the transport of patients from the Denali Borough to Fairbanks Memorial Hospital or Bassett Army Hospital.

The two ambulances we currently use are one 2002 ambulance with 72,000 miles on it and one 2006 ambulance with over 60,000 miles on it. Both of these ambulances are equipped to provide first response and are very heavy due the vast nature of medical calls here in the Borough.

We are attempting to reduce the trips to Fairbanks by these vehicles by purchasing a smaller and more fuel efficient and comfortable vehicle to transport the patients.

We are also working on a plan to provide transport for ALL EMS units in the Borough. We believe that taking all of the Borough transports may increase the number of medical volunteers in communities like Cantwell and Anderson. We have been told that one of the main contributing factors facing volunteers is the fact that at any given time they may need to transport a patient to Fairbanks and may take up to 6 hours to do so. Many volunteers cannot spend that amount of time with no notice to family or employers.

Tri-Valley Volunteer is seeking \$118,000.00 to purchase this vehicle and we ask the Denali Borough to support this project and include it on this year's Capital Equipment Request to the legislature.



\$135,000 – Denali Borough Landfill Shop. This will provide space for additional heavy equipment and storage for maintenance and repair items.

\$250,000 – Ferry Community Fire Station. There is a working fire truck now available to the Ferry Community. The Tri-Valley Volunteer Fire Department is forming a fire brigade at Ferry. A fire station will make this a functional, year-round brigade.

\$118,000 – Tri-Valley Volunteer Fire Department Ambulance. To purchase a new ambulance that will transport patients from the Denali Borough to appropriate medical facilities.

\$192,000 – Panguingue Creek Roads – Subdivision roads per Panguingue Creek Homeowners Association request.

\$600,000 – Municipal Building Project. This funding will provide full design for site development and a municipal building to accommodate the Denali Borough and the Denali Borough School District Administration with some additional office space for future use.


