#### **Project Description**

#### **Principal's Priority**

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Should this legislative grant be approved, Chugiak Elementary will be piloting a reading intervention program to be used in conjunction with our Response to Intervention block. This will require the purchase of materials as well as money for a oneyear, full-time highly qualified substitute teacher salary to carry out the duties involved in the pilot. This substitute teacher will be considered an interventionist and will work specifically with Tier II students. There are no health or retirements benefits associated with this position and it ends at the close of school for summer break.

#### **Benefits if Project is Funded**

Tier II RTI interventions are considered the first line of intervention for students who are not at benchmark with core instruction. Tier II intervention instruction is very focused and covers only targeted skill areas. The interventionist will work with these students outside of the core instruction so that below-benchmark students are not missing their Tier I instruction., hence the need for an additional staff person. Reducing the number of students with reading problems at the elementary school is critical to success especially at the middle and high school levels. Research has shown that offering highly intensive and systematic instruction provided in a low teacher-student ratios is the most effective way to achieve this necessary success (Lyon, 2008). In addition, by early identification and reading interventions, the number of children in special education can be reduced by as much as 70% (NICHD, 2013).
