Funding is needed to complete the training room and kitchen area with flooring, interior doors and final fixtures. Building is currently at 85% completion. Unexpected costs in construction such as ground preparation, roof design changes and steel costs meant the project was short approximately \$85,000.

The Salcha Fire and Rescue Chief performed as the general contractor enabling oversight with no cost to the project's budget. Volunteers have provided a tremendous portion of the construction and once complete, this structure will be valued at six times the original investment.

This fire station will enhance their response capabilities by providing heated apparatus storage designed for emergency response on site of station one. It will also allow them to have a space for a training classroom, small offices, future dorms and storage.

Project Timeline:

Construction is expected to be complete by summer 2014.
