Project Description/Justification:

Compliance with ADA and ACAA are required by Federal Law. Past ADA funding has been used to correct ADA deficiencies such as ADA-compliant fire alarms in the restrooms, elevator modifications, curb access corrections, restroom modifications, lever hardware on doors, and some signage upgrades. Additional corrections previously funded will be completed with the Terminal Redevelopment Project (TRP).

This funding will continue the Airport's compliance work and be used to complete projects in the North Terminal and areas not effected by the TRP in the South Terminal. Compliance projects will be completed in phases, correcting the most serious and necessary items first.
