Project Description/Justification:

The south end of Lakeshore Drive/Aircraft Drive is the original 1972 pavement and has severely deteriorated. Vehicles, aircraft and pedestrians share the same surface on portions of Lakeshore Drive creating a potentially hazardous condition. The potential liability from this unsafe mix of uses could easily exceed the cost of this project. The Airport Master Plan recommends this project and the general aviation pilots, FAA, Airport Operations and Safety support it.

This surface is used by Rust's Flying Service, Civil Air Patrol, US Fish and Wildlife, Troopers, museum customers and others. This project would realign the southern portion of Lakeshore/Aircraft Drive, construct a second surface to separate aircraft and vehicles, and provide pedestrian accommodations.
