Legislative M&Ms Addressed:

- o The percentage of fires that result from human actions, whether as a function of population growth or other causes
- o The percentage of fires in full and critical protection categories that are held to less than 10 acres

Purpose and need: 86% of all fires fought by the Division of Forestry are human-caused. As Alaska's population continues to move into the urban interface areas of the state the numbers of human-caused fires in these critical fire protection areas will also increase. This project will enable the Division to meet this challenge by:

- o Adding a much needed mobile initial attack force to the Division's fire program
- o Ensuring that the measure of suppressing fires in full and critical protection categories is met
- o Reducing the potential of an escaped wildland fire becoming a catastrophic incident like the Miller's Reach Fire in 1996
- o Improving the overall effectiveness of the Division's initial attack forces

This initial attack force will supplement the Division's existing initial attack firefighters as well as local government and volunteer fire departments. A successful initial attack fire costs the state thousands of dollars to suppress. A fire that escapes initial attack and becomes a project fire costs the state millions of dollars to suppress. The mobile initial fire attack force will improve the effectiveness of the Division's initial attack program and will contribute to the reduction of overall suppression costs. It will also minimize the threat of loss of private and public property from wildland fire.

One of the critical items listed in the Miller's Reach #2 Fire Review that needed improvement was the "Adequacy of Initial Attack Forces". Last summer the Division had the Kenai Type 2 EFF crew working on spruce bark beetle hazard fuels mitigation projects when they were dispatched to initial attack an urban interface fire near the Kasilof River. The crew's proximity to the fire made for a rapid initial attack that lead to the successful suppression of the fire. The Tazlina Hotshot Crew was working on hazard fuels mitigation near Homer on the east-end road when they were dispatched to a grass fire threatening structures. The quick response of the crew was instrumental in suppressing the fire with no damage to structures. In these two situations, it was pure chance that the crews were available to initial attack fires and the availability of a mobile fire attack force in areas with high fire danger will serve this purpose.

The mobile initial attack force increment will significantly increase the adequacy of the Division's initial attack forces and will be supported by local government fire departments and other cooperators. The mobile fire attack force will be managed with maximum flexibility to increase initial attack efficiencies statewide. The attack force will be trained together as a group in fire safety and fire suppression methods and will have the ability to function as an organized crew or the flexibility to be split into small groups or individuals to be prepositioned to various areas of the state during periods of high fire danger to staff fire engines and initial attack helicopters.

Increased services: The mobile initial attack force will increase and improve the effectiveness of the critical initial attack phase of wildland fire suppression in Alaska. Successful initial attack reduces the loss of private and public property and the cost of suppressing wildland fires. The mobile initial attack force will be a statewide resource and will be prepared to respond statewide to augment local firefighters as required.

**REVENUE AND OTHER BENEFITS**

Funding this increment will reduce wildland fire suppression costs and the threat of damage to private and public improvements from wildland fire in the urban interface areas of the state. The mobile initial attack force will also:

- o Increase employment opportunities for Alaska residents in the wildland fire profession
- o Increase the effectiveness of the Division's Wildland Fire Management Program
- o Improve the safety of initial attack operations by providing a highly trained and skilled force of wildland firefighters

The department receives an average of 15,000 land transactions annually which need to be reflected on our Land Status Graphic Record for the public to know what the most current land status is. Currently, the average backlog of land status updates is almost 9 months and growing. Our internal and external users tell us a 9-month delay is unacceptable and they desire the record to be current within 30 days. The land status records is available to the public on-line (through [www.dnr.state.ak.us/landrecords](http://www.dnr.state.ak.us/landrecords)), but with a 9-month backlog of updates, this is of limited use.

By adding one additional cartographer, the backlog workload can be cut about 25% per year. The projected FY2002 backlog is over 11,000 pending actions; more than half of these are more than 9 months old. Present funding at 10.2 positions is too low to maintain the public record. One additional cartographer, with minimal line item support for office supplies and training, is needed.

Operating staff in the Status Graphic Unit were steadily reduced from 19 GF positions in 1990 to 10.2 GF in FY01. Automation has permitted fewer staff to accomplish more work. Each cartographer now produces 50% more output than 12 years ago.

The primary users of the graphic land records include:

- Mining industry for managing mineral property rights;
- Oil and gas industry to assure public notification of leases, right-of-ways, water rights, and material sales;
- Forest products industry for state timber sales;
- Alaskans looking for land to purchase or lease;
- Agricultural industry for locating specially designated agriculture lands and agriculture land sales; and
- All resource managers, especially DNR managers and staff, who rely on plats for day to day decision support and documentation of decisions. Each of these

This increment assures minimal critical staffing for maintaining DNR's widely distributed computing and data communications network. DNR staff now support an average of 192 network devices per technical person. An acceptable industry average is 75 devices per technical person. DNR network staff have 2.5 times the industry average workload. Personal computers now have a central role in our office environments, 949 devices are supported across the department; 766 of these are covered by the Computer Information Center staff. One additional position will drop the ratio to twice the industry average. DNR networking business practices permit higher ratio's for support, but the current workload cannot be supported. One network technical position is needed help meet these many demands.

Technology changes are driving improvements in government business practices; technical expertise is essential for assuring reliable solutions to DNR staff and the public. Inadequate staffing means slow response times for solving users' network or computer issues which cuts worker productivity and limits the public's electronic services from DNR.

The primary area of responsibility for this position will be in Palmer / Mat-Su where DNR has shown the largest growth. There are about 93 network devices in Palmer alone, about half of them are at the new Forestry fire facility, the others are for the Recorder's Office, State Parks, and the Division of Agriculture. This position is needed to assure Palmer and Mat-Su staff receive acceptable service for their computer needs, especially during the high demand fire season. The Division of Agriculture's Plant Material Center is projected to increase their staffing needs and thus will require more computer support.

A \$400.0 increment is requested so that the division can perform its essential duties to manage the state's oil and gas resources. Those resources are vital to government revenues and the state's economy as a whole. Without this increment, the division won't get leases issued timely to industry, won't be able to accurately collect and account for state revenues, and won't be able to evaluate industry proposals properly and timely.

\$125.0 will fund vacant positions. For some time budget constraints have forced the division to leave mission critical positions vacant. The division cannot fulfill its obligations and commitments to oil and gas development, exploration, and research. It cannot operate efficiently without filling these positions.

Three examples highlight the vacancy problem. First, the November 15, 2000 lease sale resulted in bids on the most acreage in State history, and the second highest number of bids ever. Although this is good news for the state, we must now adjudicate (validate) these leases before issuing them. Our vacancies will cause delays in issuing the leases, causing delays in issuing permits, causing delays in drilling and exploration. Second, the lessees have filed hundreds of assignment applications as a result of the Prudhoe alignment. The alignment is only partly completed since Chevron and Texaco are not yet aligned. Each new alignment generates hundreds more assignments to process. Again the vacancies will cause delays in issuing assignments, causing uncertainties in land ownership and in royalty payments. Third, the "aligned" lessees are seeking to "reshape" (expansion, contraction) units and participating areas. We received six such requests and more are expected (this is in addition to the "normal" work load). Vacancies and lack of adequate staff may cause complete failure to process these requests causing delays in drilling. Any delay in drilling and exploration will impact state revenues.

\$75.0 will fund an Analyst/Programmer IV position with duties split 75/25 between royalty accounting (OGRA) and lease administration. OGRA duties include assisting industry and the public in accessing the public records portion of the OGRA databases and streamlining OGRA systems so that the state's oil and gas revenues can be collected timely and accurately. Lease administration duties include developing a program to allow lessees to file lease assignments electronically using electronic signature protocols and allow staff to electronically enter approved lease assignment information into the OGRA and LAS databases. This programmer will also work on a comprehensive database for unitization. Electronic reporting, Oracle database audits, and WEB-based access to information is the norm in the oil and gas industry.

\$80.0 is requested for contractual services. A portion will fund maintenance on our hardware and software, legal notices, and annual reports and brochures. The division will also acquire exploration and stratigraphic test data from permittees, which we must pay for as a condition of the issuance of a land use permit. These data are essential to the leasing, exploration, and development of the state's petroleum resources. We use these data to gauge industry's proposals to explore, develop and produce hydrocarbons on state lands. The division will contract for a consultant to analyze the West Coast market for ANS oil and forecast potential changes in the market created by the merger of BP and ARCO and the sale of ARCO Alaska, Inc. to Phillips Petroleum. The consultant will advise the division in its negotiations with Alaska's major oil producers to value the state's royalty oil. Because of contractually mandated "reopeners," these negotiations are basically on going and the division needs a consultant on a continuing basis. The outcome of these negotiations directly affects state resources.

\$55.0 will be used to purchase software and licenses to interpret the huge quantity of seismic data used to evaluate oil and gas lease sale areas, units, and participating areas. Because of the oil industry's extensive and growing use of 3D seismic data as an exploration and production tool, the volume of seismic data available to our technical staff has grown beyond our ability to properly evaluate and utilize the information. We will also purchase the new standard database for

The Division of Oil and Gas requests an amendment to its FY2002 budget. This amendment seeks an additional \$425,000 increment to the Governor's original budget increment of \$400,000. The total increment sought for FY2002 is \$825,000.

The purpose of this amendment request is to fund salary increases for key positions. These actions will make the division's salaries competitive with the salaries of its counterparts in the federal government, the Minerals Management Service (MMS). These actions, however, will not make the division's salaries on par with industry's salaries.

Without a substantial increment the division will not be able to retain or attract the qualified personnel (geoscientists, engineers, land managers, petroleum business analysts, etc.) necessary to perform its required core business functions. The magnitude of the problem is illustrated by the division's recent losses of the director, deputy director/petroleum investment manager and lease sales personnel. Of that group, those that have sought immediate employment have gotten salary increases of 50-100 percent in the petroleum industry or as consultants. The director is also personally aware that eight other division employees are actively considering jobs within the petroleum industry or with other government agencies.

The "brain drain" is particularly acute for several reasons. The required expertise is in high demand and there are few qualified experts that meet the division's requirements. One major business function of the division is to assure that the state gets its proper royalty share of produced oil and gas. Maximizing our royalty dollars requires that the division's employees use the same advanced technology and interpretation tools that their industry counterparts use in order to negotiate the proper royalty rate for a producing field. Dramatic advances in technology have revolutionized the methods and tools used to do this interpretation. Very few people have both these skills and the Alaska specific knowledge to do this work. It typically requires the appropriate advanced degree and 10-20 years

The division needs these experts because subtle changes in interpretation of geologic and engineering data has the effect of changing the state royalty share by hundreds of millions of dollars per oil field.</p> <p>Another major business function of the division is to determine the appropriate value of state royalty oil. The Denali Block is the unofficial name given to the area along the Denali Highway between Paxon and Cantwell. Over the last few years there has been a great deal of mineral exploration in the area. Results of geophysical exploration indicate the potential for a significant deposit of rare minerals of the Platinum group. These rare and valuable minerals have spurred a great deal of interest and exploration by mineral companies.

The area is also used very heavily for hunting, camping and recreation. It is a part of the range of the Nelchina Caribou herd and is important for sport hunting and subsistence.

Finally, the area includes the Tangle Lakes Archaeological district. Specifically, the area includes 226,660 acres between mileposts 17 and 37 along the Denali Highway and is rich in historic and prehistoric remains. The district contains more than 400 archaeological sites, making this one of the densest concentrations of archaeological resources in the North American Subarctic.

In 1971 the Tangle Lakes Archaeological District was nominated and accepted to the National Register of Historic Places. This is our nation's official list of historic properties worthy of recognition for their significance in telling our nation's story. In 1993 a revised Tangle Lakes Archaeological District was accepted. The 1993 boundary attempts to follow natural features such as natural drainages and certain elevations to identify the boundary of the National Register District.

A Push for Conveyance:

The 1994 selection process prioritized much of the area as high priority for conveyance to the state. The recent mineral indications have raised the priority for some parts of the area. Thus, the state expects that it will eventually own much of the area. Because of the distrust of the federal government ability to tolerate mining on federal lands, no company is willing to commit the millions of dollars of exploration funds until the land is in state hands.

In public meetings in 1994, the public asked the state to select the area and to prioritize it for eventual conveyance. The mining industry has asked that the state make this a high priority for immediate conveyance.

This year, DNR put the eastern portion of the area, north of the Denali Highway on its conveyance priority list. Conveyance will accelerate mining. This means that there will be a greater likelihood of millions of dollars of mineral exploration funds being spent. It also means that some tens of thousands of dollars for mineral rents will come to the state. Finally, it means that the state will have the opportunity and responsibility to manage the recreational use. The area DNR is asking BLM to convey includes approximately 8 townships in the eastern end of the block. The area is all north of the Denali Highway and includes approximately 1/4 of BLM's archaeological district.

**With Ownership Comes Responsibility:**

Because of the sensitivity of the Archaeological District, the state must manage the area so that expected use does not degrade the cultural resources or wildlife habitat, nor generally degrade the views and landscape that have made the area so valuable to Alaskans.

The expected mining exploration involves minimal disturbance. It is expected to be done by a few large, reputable companies. Thus, the exploration requires planning to ensure that occurs consistent with the cultural, wildlife, and recreational resources, but the activity is relatively easy to control. The recreation and hunting use is much more difficult. Unregulated public use will almost certainly result in impacts to the ubiquitous cultural resources. BLM has established strict regulations within the archaeological district to protect the resources. With ownership comes the responsibility for the state to protect those resources. That is, the state cannot replace BLM as the land manager without replacing the service that BLM has been able to provide Alaskans.

The state proposes the following:

1. Establish a Special Use Area over the its portion of the Archaeological District. A special use area allows DNR to require a permit for activities that are otherwise generally permitted on state land. Because of the sensitivity of the area, greater control is warranted for this area.
2. A Leasehold Location Order. A leasehold location order conditions the property right to the minerals with stipulations that are typically designed to eliminate conflict with a significant surface use. In this case these are the cultural and other resources on the surface. In this way the actual property right to the mineral established by a mining claim (in this case a leasehold location) will be conditioned to protect the archaeological resources.
3. Management - People on the Ground. The paper protections given in a special use area and a leasehold location order do not protect the resources without people on the ground to makes sure the rules are followed. BLM provides this today. DNR must provide it if we are to assure Alaskans that one of the most precious cultural heritage sites remain protected. Ensuring compliance for mining exploration can be done with existing staff, but the continuous and variable recreation use requires a seasonal on-the-ground presence. To that end, this budget amendment proposes a part-time Natural Resource Officer position with a vehicle and ATV to be located during the summer months on the site.
4. Contract with the state Office of History & Archaeology for a summer project to continue BLM's inventory of the site so that the Department will have the knowledge to protect the resources. The contract will provide funds to:
  - Monitor impacts and assess potential impacts to known archaeological sites and to areas with high archaeological potential.
  - Verify site locations and accurately map them using air photographs and GPS.
  - Evaluate the physical condition of sites and assess the level of management needed.
  - Conduct archaeological surveys in areas that have not been adequately documented.
  - Coordinate planning and field activities with other DNR managers, e.g., Lands and Mining issues.

Why is this important now?

In the past few months as word got out that DNR requested the eastern portion of the area to be on BLM's conveyance priority list, we received a lot of pressure

At the same time, we learned of the archaeological importance of the area and the extent of recreational use. It was only after we learned of these that we understood that a management presence was critical to our accepting conveyance. Our concern was reinforced once we learned that BLM's regional solicitor was reviewing this conveyance against their cultural resource protection laws. It appears that they are looking to ensure that the state has the ability to accept conveyance in a manner that protects the cultural resources. In order to re-staff this program to a level that could carry out the statutory requirements of the Water Use Act a general fund increment of \$300,000 is necessary. This increment will cover the cost of five additional permanent full time positions, including an Administrative Clerk II, 2-NRO I, and 2-NRO II. The increment includes additional 200-500 funds and full funding of an existing NRT I position.

This increment allows the Water Management Unit to adjudicate all new water right applications for more than a significant amount of water within 60 days of receipt, review all water rights for less than a significant amount of water within 45 days of receipt and process any request for temporary water use within 30 days of receipt. In addition the backlog of water right actions will be worked as necessary.

The three-part solution outlined in Key Component Issues includes program changes that would establish a water application registry system and decrease the workload on the water management staff. It would also amend the statute under AS 45.15 to allow the Department to establish a "water user fee".

The establishment of a user fee system will require about 1 year to promulgate regulations, establish a revenue and billing system, and update the water right files to be included in the user fee billing system. By FY03 the regulations, updated water rights and revenue and billing system should be in place. At that time we plan to request the legislature to allow DNR to receive these funds as dedicated program receipts and decrease our general fund appropriation revenues by the amount anticipated to be received that year. As the user fee system and the water right system merge, and as revenue increase, less general funds will be requested in future years. The goal is to have the water user fees totally replace the general funds for this program.

Purpose and need: Value-added sales that support in-state processing are the core of DNR's timber sale program. DNR tailors its sales to local processors, many of whom run small to medium operations. Local processors provide jobs for Alaskans and local wood products. However, they often lack the capital and expertise to successfully complete reforestation or thinning activities on state sales. Access to some harvest areas also requires investments in roads, bridges, and other crossings that cannot be borne by individual sales. This project maintains and expands the timber base for value-added sales by

- o providing additional funding for reforestation and timber stand improvement on state forest lands,
- o funding access to harvest areas that will provide timber for multiple sales over many years, and
- o contributing to staff support for timber sale design, layout, contract administration, and reforestation.

These investments will provide jobs to Alaskans. Reforestation and thinning will also sustain wildlife habitat, recreation and tourism, water resources, and other values of state forests. Proper construction of bridges and crossings also protects water resources and improves public safety.

Increased Services: This increment would pay for a mix of reforestation, thinning, timber sale preparation, and access work. A typical mix of annual accomplishments would include reforestation of about 600 acres in southcentral and interior Alaska, and 20-25 acres of pre-commercial thinning (also called timber stand improvement) in dense, productive forests in southeast Alaska. It would also construct river and railroad crossings, and establish central haul roads. This effort would open or maintain areas for multiple timber sales where individual sales can't pay the costs for regional access.

Reforestation tasks include site preparation, seedling purchases, and planting. The increment is less than the total reforestation cost. DNR will continue to use natural regeneration to keep down reforestation costs where feasible, and will continue to include costs of reforestation in timber sale contracts where the sale can bear the cost and the purchasers have the expertise to replant successfully.

**REVENUE AND OTHER BENEFITS**

This increment will provide benefits throughout the state. It stimulates the economy by building the foundation for a continued value-added timber sale program. It opens areas to value-add local operators and provides opportunities for new operations. It will reduce the costs of individual value-added sales. Examples of annual benefits from a typical mix of activities statewide would include:

- o Expand the area available for value-added sales, and improve access for forest management, including reforestation, thinning, and commercial and personal-use timber harvests.
- o Provide direct employment to more than 10 tree planters, and 20-25 jobs in timber harvesting and transportation, plus indirect jobs.
- o Generate 6-8 MMBF in sales to 7-10 Alaskan businesses from sales on reforested land.

These facilities are located in temperate regions. Plant material that may prove to be hardy and of economic value for Alaska often does not perform well under the temperate weather conditions and shorter photo periods during the growing season at the present APHIS facilities.
