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Key Component Issues for FY2002 – 2003

Medicaid Program Management

Current economic and health care trends in Alaska continue to exert increasing pressure on state health care managers and policy makers to provide clear, demonstrated evidence of the following:

The capacity to consistently produce comprehensive, accurate, and timely information and data/trends analyses to provide legislators, policy makers, health care providers, and the public the base from which to measure how well that health care management capability is actually performing; and

The ability to effectively and efficiently disseminate that information to policy makers, legislators, our customers, and the public.

The division has committed to a sustained effort to build and support a quality medical services program with quality technical and management expertise. This effort will be realized through implementation of innovative and effective business practices that will assure the governor, the legislature, and the public that our clients receive and enjoy the benefits of a responsive and fiscally responsible Medicaid service delivery system.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2001

Medical Assistance Administration

DMA continued to meet the medical needs of 1 of every 6 Alaskans, most of whom would have had no other means of coverage for necessary medical care. The division's cost for the administration of the Medicaid and CAMA programs equaled only 3.3% of the total dollars paid for those medical care services.

Medicaid Refinancing

To maximize Alaska's options for saving state general funds, Medicaid refinancing identifies programs that are eligible for federal Medicaid funding, and works with those programs to capture and utilize those federal funds. This requires indepth research and evaluation, assessment of refinancing opportunities, development of a financing methodology and program-specific criteria, and ongoing post project implementation monitoring. In FY01 successful refinancing efforts involved Disproportionate Share Hospitals (DSH), Behavioral Rehabilitative Services (BRS), and continued ProShare payments.
