Project Description/Justification:

Fairbanks Public Safety Building Indoor Firing Range

In August 2002 Nortech Environmental and Engineering Consultants conducted a lead dust risk assessment of the indoor range. Based on Nortech's assessment they recommended the use of the range be discontinued until the range is properly cleaned, a mechanical system's evaluation is completed, and a comprehensive written range maintenance plan is completed. Nortech also recommended additional assessment of the mechanical system to determine the extent of contamination as lead may have contaminated the entire building HVAC system.

Project Needs Statement

The Fairbanks DPS Indoor Range is the only indoor range suitable for law enforcement use in interior Alaska. Although currently not in use, various federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies have utilized this range. While outdoor ranges at Ft. Wainwright are sometimes available, military use is a priority and scheduling has been problematic. Additionally, the extreme Arctic climate in interior Alaska greatly hampers outdoor firearms training for much of the year.

Documentation of Capital Costs

The cost breakout to assess the lead content at the Fairbanks Public Safety Building Indoor Firing Range is as follows:

Professional Services (consultant & design)	\$28,000
Contractor Clean-up:	\$25,000
Indirect Costs:	\$ 2,000
20% Contingency:	\$11,000
Project Total:	\$66,000

Identification of Alternatives Considered

Law enforcement utilizes an outdoor range as weather permits which is located on the property of the Fairbanks International Airport. This outdoor range is scheduled to be out of service in the summer of 2003 due to construction at the airport.

Without an indoor range for law enforcement use in interior Alaska firearm proficiency of various law enforcement agencies will be hampered.
